HOUSE BILL No. 6161

September 30, 1992, Introduced by Reps. Perry Bullard, Gubow and Jondahl and referred to the Committee on Labor.

A bill to prohibit discrimination in employment of individuals relative to their engaging in certain activities outside the course of their employment; and to prescribe penalties and remedies.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "workers' free speech act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Employee" means a person who performs a service for
- 5 wages or other remuneration under a contract of hire, written or
- 6 oral, express or implied.
- 7 (b) "Employer" means a person who has 5 or more employees.
- 8 Sec. 3. An employer shall not require as a condition of
- 9 employment that an employee or prospective employee refrain from
- 10 or engage in any of the following outside the course of his or

- I her employment, or otherwise discriminate against an employee
- 2 with respect to his or her compensation or other terms or condi-
- 3 tions of employment for refraining from or engaging in any of the
- 4 following outside the course of his or her employment:
- 5 (a) Speaking, writing, expressing, or publishing his or her 6 views.
- 7 (b) Peacefully assembling with others.
- 8 (c) Engaging in political activities.
- 9 Sec. 4. This act does not prohibit a term or condition of
- 10 employment that is reasonably necessary to the normal operation
- II of the employer's business or enterprise.
- 12 Sec. 5. (1) A person alleging a violation of this act may
- 13 bring a civil action for appropriate injunctive relief or dam-
- 14 ages, or both. Each violation constitutes a separate offense.
- 15 (2) An action commenced under this act may be brought in
- 16 circuit court for the county in which the alleged violation
- 17 occurred or for the county in which the employer against whom the
- 18 civil complaint is filed resides or has his or her principal
- 19 place of business.
