

SENATE BILL No. 152

March 7, 1991, Introduced by Senators EHLERS, GAST and POLLACK and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of natural resources for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1991; to provide for certain work projects; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials; and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 101. There is appropriated for the department of natural
2 resources to supplement former appropriations for the fiscal year ending
3 September 30, 1991, from the following funds:

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14 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized under
15 this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards, offices, and
16 programs for which an appropriation is made under this act are subject to
17 the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984,
18 being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

19 Sec. 203. For all projects and grant programs funded under this
20 act, the commission of natural resources or the department of natural
21 resources shall notify each legislator whose district is to receive a
22 grant 7 days before the grant is announced.

23 ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE

24 Sec. 301. The appropriation in section 101 for environmental pro-
25 tection bond site reclamation loan and grant program shall not be

1 encumbered or expended until both of the following conditions have been
2 met:

3 (a) Rules are promulgated under section 8(a)(i) of Act No. 328 of
4 the Public Acts of 1988, being section 299.678 of the Michigan Compiled
5 Laws.

6 (b) The department has reported to the senate and house appropria-
7 tions subcommittees on natural resources those projects that have been
8 approved for expenditure by the commission of natural resources under
9 this program.

10 Sec. 302. The unexpended portion of the appropriation in
11 section 101 for environmental protection bond alternative municipal water
12 supply projects, surface cleanup projects, site investigations, final
13 cleanup projects, operation and maintenance, and the site reclamation
14 loan and grant program shall be considered work projects and shall not
15 lapse to the environmental protection bond fund but continue to be avail-
16 able for the purposes appropriated.

17 WASTE MANAGEMENT

18 Sec. 401. The appropriation for landfill and dump closures in sec-
19 tion 101 is to be provided in order of priority as listed.

20 Sec. 402. The unexpended portion of the appropriation in
21 section 101 for waste management projects shall be considered a work
22 project and shall not lapse to the environmental protection bond fund but
23 shall continue to be available for the purpose for which it was
24 appropriated.
