- Sec. 204. (1) It is the intent of the legislature that the funds appropriated in section 101 will permit the department to carry out each program for the entire fiscal year, unless a shorter period is

- 25 (2) The department shall not make or authorize an expenditure 26 or incur an obligation that exceeds or results in spending that will

- exceed the amount appropriated in section 101 or as otherwise provided

The department of state may carry over unexpended snowmobile and off-road vehicle fee collections as authorized by Act No. 74 of the Public Acts of 1968, being sections 257.1501 to 257.1518 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, and Act No. 319 of the Public Acts of 1975, being sections 257.1601 to 257.1626 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, to fund following year programs in the department of state and the department as appropriated by the legislature.

GEOLOGICAL SURVEY
