THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 township, or incorporated village employed and compensated upon a
- 2 full-time basis; A VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT OF A CITY, TOWN-

- 17 RESULTING THEREFROM. AS USED IN THIS SUBDIVISION, "OCCUPATIONAL
- 18 CANCER" MEANS CANCER CAUSED BY EXPOSURE TO SMOKE, FUMES, OR CAR-
- 19 CINOGENIC, POISONOUS, TOXIC, OR CHEMICAL SUBSTANCES WHILE IN THE
- 20 PERFORMANCE OF DUTIES FOR THE DEPARTMENT.
- 21 (2) Such respiratory and heart diseases -or AND illnesses
- 22 resulting therefrom, AND OCCUPATIONAL CANCER AND ILLNESSES
- 23 RESULTING THEREFROM are deemed to arise out of and in the course
- 24 of employment in the absence of evidence to the contrary.
- 25 (3) As a condition precedent to filing an application for
- 26 benefits, the claimant, if he or she is one of those enumerated
- 27 in subsection (1), shall first make application APPLY for, and

- 1 do all things necessary to qualify for any pension benefits which
- 2 he or she, or his or her decedent, may be entitled to. If a
- 3 final determination is made that pension benefits shall not be
- 4 awarded, then the presumption of "personal injury" as provided in
- 5 this section shall apply. The employer or employee may request 2
- 6 copies of the determination denying pension benefits, 1 copy of
- 7 which may be filed with the bureau.
