THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Section 707 of Act No. 258 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1974, as added by Act No. 186 of the Public Acts of 1984, being
- 3 section 330.1707 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:

"Mental health code,"

- 5 Sec. 707. (1) A minor 14 years of age or older may request
- 6 and receive CONSENT TO THE PROVISION OF mental health services
- 7 and a mental -heath- HEALTH professional may provide mental
- 8 health services TO THE MINOR on an outpatient basis,
- 9 excluding pregnancy termination referral services and the use of

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- 1 chemotherapy, without the consent -or knowledge- of the minor's
- 2 parent, guardian, or person in loco parentis. Except as other-
- 3 wise provided in this section, the minor's parent, guardian, or
- 4 person in loco parentis shall not be informed of the services
- 5 without the consent of the minor unless the mental health profes-
- 6 sional treating the minor determines that there is a compelling
- 7 need for disclosure based on a substantial probability of harm to
- 8 the minor or to other persons, and if THE MENTAL HEALTH PROFES-
- 9 SIONAL SHALL INFORM THE MINOR'S PARENT, GUARDIAN, OR PERSON IN
- 10 LOCO PARENTIS OF THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES PROVIDED TO THE
- 11 MINOR. THE MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL SHALL INFORM the minor -is
- 12 notified of the mental health professional's -intent DUTY to
- 13 inform the minor's parent, guardian, or person in loco parentis
- 14 UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
- 15 (2) -Services provided A MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL SHALL
- 16 PROVIDE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES to a minor pursuant to this sec-
- 17 tion -shall- THAT, to the extent possible, promote the minor's
- 18 relationship to the parent, guardian, or person in loco parentis,
- 19 and -shall DO not undermine the values that the parent, guardi-
- 20 an, or person in loco parentis has sought to instill in the
- 21 minor.
- 22 (3) -Services provided A MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL SHALL
- 23 NOT PROVIDE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES to a minor pursuant to this
- 24 section shall be limited to not more than THAT EXCEED
- 25 12 sessions or 4 months per request for MENTAL HEALTH services.
- 26 After the twelfth session or fourth month of MENTAL HEALTH

- (b) "Mental health professional" means a mental health pro-
- 19 fessional as defined in R 330.1001 of the Michigan administrative
- 20 code.
- 21 (c) "Person in loco parentis" means a person in loco paren-
- 22 tis as defined in section 498c.
