8	this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards, offices, and
9	programs for which an appropriation is made under this act are subject to
10	the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984,
11	being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
12	Sec. 203. For all projects and grant programs funded under this
13	act, the commission of natural resources or the department of natural
14	resources shall notify each legislator whose district is to receive a
15	grant 7 days before the grant is announced.

16 RECREATION GRANTS

Sec. 301. The commission of natural resources shall annually report to the governor, the house and senate appropriations committees, the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on natural resources, the joint capital outlay subcommittee, the house and senate standing committees on natural resources, and the house and senate fiscal agencies on the progress of the appropriations for recreation bond grants made under this act. This report shall include the criteria used for grant selection; a list of all applicants and those sites funded, including the name, address, county, and telephone number of the recipient or participant; bond funded actions taken at each site; and other information considered pertinent by the commission of natural resources.
