- 13 Sec. 201. In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of arti-
- 14 cle IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending in this
- 15 appropriation act is \$8,485,700.00 and state appropriations to be paid to
- 16 local units of government in section 101 are \$0.
- 17 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized under
- 18 this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards, offices, and
- 19 programs for which an appropriation is made under this act are subject to
- 20 the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984,
- 21 being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 22 Sec. 203. As used in this act:
- 23 (a) "DAG-FNS" means the United States department of agriculture food
- 24 and nutrition services.

- 1 (b) "DAG-FS" means the United States department of
- 2 agriculture-forest service.
- 3 (c) "DOC-NOAA" means the United States department of
- 4 commerce-national oceanic and atmospheric administration.
- 5 (d) "DOI" means the United States department of interior.
- 6 (e) "DOI-FWS" means the ODI-fish and wildlife service.
- 7 (f) "DOT" means the United States department of transportation.
- 8 (g) "EPA" means the United States environmental protection agency.
- 9 (h) "EPA-LUST trust" means the EPA-leaking underground storage tank
- 10 trust fund.

- 15 Sec. 301. Included in section 101 is an amount not to exceed
- 16 \$500,000.00 for promotion of attendance at pari-mutuel horse racing. The
- 17 state funds shall be matched before expenditure such that each \$2.00 of
- 18 state funds is matched by \$1.00 of private industry funds. A race meet-
- 19 ing licensee or an association of thoroughbred and harness racetracks or
- 20 any horsemen's group may submit a plan and proposal to the racing commis-
- 21 sioner for use of funds authorized to be expended for promotion of
- 22 attendance at pari-mutuel horse racing. A plan shall be submitted by the
- 23 commissioner to the chairpersons of the senate and house subcommittees on
- 24 agriculture at least 30 days before the funds may be expended. Each

- 1 licensee or association of thoroughbred and harness racetracks or
- 2 horsemen's group shall be eligible for promotional funds.
- 3 Sec. 302. The department may carry forward unexpended appropriated
- 4 funds from the thoroughbred and standardbred sire stakes programs pursu-
- 5 ant to section 13(9) and (10) of the racing law of 1980, Act No. 327 of
- 6 the Public Acts of 1980, being section 431.73 of the Michigan Compiled
- 7 Laws, for the purposes of reimbursement of sire stakes purses for
- 8 Michigan bred 2- and 3-year-old horse races held in the following fiscal
- 9 year.
- 10 Sec. 303. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), the appropria-
- 11 tion of \$299,500.00 in section 101 for purses and supplements licensed
- 12 tracks is intended to provide state purse supplements for 4 races at
- 13 state licensed pari-mutuel horse racing tracks. The purse supplements
- 14 are to be used for races comprised only of Michigan bred horses segre-
- 15 gated into a 4-year-old colt trot division, a 4-year-old filly trot divi-
- 16 sion, a 4-year-old colt pace division, and a 4-year-old filly pace
- 17 division.
- 18 (2) Of the \$299,500.00 appropriated in section 101 for purses and
- 19 supplements licensed tracks, \$74,900.00 shall be allocated as follows:
- 20 Arabian and Appaloosa horse racing.....\$ 18,700
- 22 (3) The allocations made pursuant to this section shall be consid-
- 23 ered allocations for work projects and the unexpended balances shall be
- 24 carried forward and shall not lapse until expended.
