EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

A bill to make appropriations for the department of agriculture for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993; to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; to create funds; to provide for the imposition of fees; to require reports, audits, and plans; to authorize certain transfers by certain state agencies.

26	Sec. 201. (1) In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of
27	article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending in

- 1 this appropriation act is \$47,616,400.00 and state appropriations to be 2 paid to local units of government in section 101 are as follows:
- 3 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
- 6 (2) When it appears to the principal executive officer of each 7 department that state spending to local units of government will be less 8 than the amount that was projected to be expended for any quarter, the 9 principal executive officer shall immediately give notice of the 10 approximate shortfall to the department of management and budget, the 11 senate and house appropriations committees, and the senate and house 12 fiscal agencies.
- Sec. 202. The appropriations made and the expenditures authorized 14 under this act and the institutions, departments, agencies, commissions, 15 boards, offices, and programs for which an appropriation is made under 16 this act are subject to the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the 17 Public Acts of 1984, being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan 18 Compiled Laws.
- 19 Sec. 203. As used in this act:
- 20 (a) "Department" means the department of agriculture.
- 21 (b) "Director" means the director of the department.
- 22 (c) "DAG-AMS" means the United States department of
- 23 agriculture-agriculture marketing service.
- 24 (d) "DAG-APHIS" means the United States department of 25 agriculture-animal plant health inspection service.
- 26 (e) "DAG-FNS" means the United States department of 27 agriculture-food and nutrition service.

- 1 (f) "DAG-FS" means the United States department of 2 agriculture-forest service.
- 3 (g) "DAG-SRS" means the United States department of 4 agriculture-statistical reporting service.
- 5 (h) "DAG-VS" means the United States department of 6 agriculture-veterinary science.
- 7 (i) "EPA-OE" means the United States environmental protection 8 agency-office of enforcement.
- 9 (j) "EPA-OWWM" means the United States environmental protection 10 agency-office of water and waste management.
- (k) "FTE" means full-time equated.
- 12 (1) "HHS-FDA" means the United States department of health and 13 human services-food and drug administration.
- 14 (m) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.
- Sec. 204. The department may receive and expend funds in addition 16 to those authorized in section 101 for conducting training and 17 orientation workshops and seminars that are consistent with the 18 programmatic mission of the individual unit sponsoring or coordinating 19 the program.
- Sec. 205. The funds appropriated in section 101 from the central 21 funds for acquiring additional federal funds shall not be expended until 22 the grant money is authorized by the grantor. Expenditure of those funds 23 shall be controlled through the allotment process. Funds accepted under 24 this section shall not be authorized if the receipt of the funds mandates 25 a commitment for state funding at a future date.
- Sec. 206. (1) Beginning October 1, 1992, there shall be a hiring 27 freeze imposed on the state classified civil service. State departments 28 and agencies shall be prohibited from hiring any new full-time state

- 1 classified civil service employees or prohibited from filling any vacant 2 state classified civil service positions. This hiring freeze does not 3 apply to internal transfers of classified employees from one position to 4 another within a department.
- 5 (2) The director of the department of management and budget shall 6 grant exceptions to this hiring freeze when the director believes that 7 such a hiring freeze will result in rendering a state department or 8 agency unable to deliver basic services, cause loss of revenue to the 9 State, result in the inability of the State to receive and expend federal 10 funds, or necessitate additional expenditures that exceed any savings 11 from maintaining a vacancy.

12 EXECUTIVE

- Sec. 301. The appropriations in section 101 may be used for per 14 diem payments to members of boards, committees, and commissions for a 15 full day's board, committee, or commission work at which a quorum is 16 present; for attending a hearing as authorized by the respective board, 17 committee, or commission; or for performing official business as autho-18 rized by the respective board, committee, or commission. The per diem 19 payments shall be at a rate as follows:
- Sec. 303. In any given year when insufficient amounts of Michigan 27 surplus products are offered to the food bank council and accepted for 28 distribution, unused funds may be applied by the food bank council for

- 1 the direct purchase of foods from Michigan growers, manufacturers and/or 2 wholesalers.
- 3 ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES
- Sec. 401. The department may receive and expend funds for audit 5 and licensing functions.
- Sec. 402. The department may receive and expend funds to conduct 7 livestock sales at the Upper Peninsula state fairgrounds.
- 8 PESTICIDE AND PLANT PEST MANAGEMENT
- 9 Sec. 501. The department may receive and expend funds for 10 propagating and certifying virus free foundation stock.
- 11 FOOD AND CONSUMER PROTECTION
- 12 Sec. 601. The department may receive and expend funds to 13 administer the gasoline inspection and testing program.
- 14 Sec. 602. The department may receive and expend funds to conduct 15 bean inspection and grading services.
- Sec. 603. The department may receive and expend funds to conduct 17 inspection of fruits and vegetables at shipping, termination points and 18 processing plants.
- 19 LABORATORY SUPPORT
- 20 Sec. 701. The department may receive and expend funds to test 21 samples for other agencies and organizations.
- 22 OFFICE OF RACING COMMISSIONER
- Sec. 801. The racing commissioner may pay rewards of not more than 24 \$5,800.00 to a person who provides information which results in the 25 arrest and conviction on a felony charge for a crime which involves the 26 horse racing industry. A reward paid pursuant to this section shall be 27 paid out of the licensing and regulation line item.

Sec. 802. Included in section 101 is an amount not to exceed 2 \$400,000.00 for promotion of attendance at pari-mutuel horse racing. The 3 state funds shall be matched before expenditure such that each \$2.00 of 4 state funds is matched by \$1.00 of private industry funds.
