A bill to establish the fund to aid indigent relief in the department of social services; and to provide certain powers and duties of the department of social services.

Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "fund to aid indigent relief act".

Sec. 2. As used in this act:

- (a) "Department" means the department of social services.
- (b) "Emergency social service assistance" means assistance that could not have been funded for the individual applying for assistance by any program that was funded under the social welfare act, Act No. 280 of the Public Acts of 1939, being sections 400.1 to 400.121 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, at the time the application was made.
 - (c) "Fund" means the fund to aid indigent relief.

- 1 Sec. 3. (1) The fund to aid indigent relief is created in
- 2 the state treasury. The fund shall consist of all money credited
