## ADDENDUM TO SENATE FISCAL AGENCY ANALYSIS DATED 10-5-93

The House Corrections Committee adopted substitutes for the bills that differed from the Senate-passed versions in the following ways:

- A prisoner would have to consent in writing to a transfer to another state, unless the transfer was required to protect the prisoner's safety.
- Entrance into the interstate compact would not impair or abrogate the rights of crime victims as enumerated under the Crime Victim's Rights Act.
- The Department of Corrections would be required to report annually to the legislative standing and appropriations subcommittees on corrections on the numbers, costs and reasons for transfers of prisoners under the compact.
