

HOUSE BILL No. 4064

February 2, 1993, Introduced by Rep. Gubow and referred to the Committee on Human Services and Children.

A bill to amend section 3 of Act No. 91 of the Public Acts of 1970, entitled as amended "Child custody act of 1970," as amended by Act No. 434 of the Public Acts of 1980, being section 722.23 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Section 3 of Act No. 91 of the Public Acts of 2 1970, as amended by Act No. 434 of the Public Acts of 1980, being 3 section 722.23 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read 4 as follows:
- Sec. 3. "Best interests of the child" means the sum total of the following factors to be considered, evaluated, and determined by the court:

- (a) The love, affection, and other emotional ties existing
 between the parties involved and the child.
- 3 (b) The capacity and disposition of the parties involved to
- 4 give the child love, affection, and guidance and continuation of
- 5 the educating and raising of the child in -its HIS OR HER reli-
- 6 gion or creed, if any.
- 7 (c) The capacity and disposition of the parties involved to
- 8 provide the child with food, clothing, medical care or other
- 9 remedial care recognized and permitted under the laws of this
- 10 state in place of medical care, and other material needs.
- (d) The length of time the child has lived in a stable, sat-
- 12 isfactory environment, and the desirability of maintaining
- 13 continuity.
- (e) The permanence, as a family unit, of the existing or
- 15 proposed custodial home or homes.
- (f) The moral fitness of the parties involved.
- (g) The mental and physical health of the parties involved.
- (h) The home, school, and community record of the child.
- 19 (i) The reasonable preference of the child, if the court
- 20 -deems CONSIDERS the child to be of sufficient age to express
- 21 preference.
- 22 (j) The willingness and ability of each of the parents to
- 23 facilitate and encourage a close and continuing parent-child
- 24 relationship between the child and the other parent.
- 25 (K) DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE VIOLENCE
- 26 WAS DIRECTED AGAINST OR WITNESSED BY THE CHILD.

(l) Any other factor considered by the court to be 2 relevant to a particular child custody dispute.
