



HOUSE BILL No. 4248

February 11, 1993, Introduced by Rep. Bankes and referred to the Committee on Human Services and Children.

A bill to provide for the suspension of certain occupational licenses under certain circumstances; and to provide for certain powers and duties for certain state agencies.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
2 "regulated occupation support enforcement act".

3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:

4 (a) "License" means a certificate, registration, or license
5 issued by an occupational regulatory agency which allows an indi-
6 vidual to engage in a regulated occupation or which allows an
7 individual to use a specific title in the practice of an occupa-
8 tion, profession, or vocation.

9 (b) "Occupational regulatory agency" means a department,
10 bureau, or agency of the state of Michigan that has regulatory
11 authority over a regulated occupation.

1 (c) "Office of the friend of the court" means the agency
2 created pursuant to section 3 of the friend of the court act, Act
3 No. 294 of the Public Acts of 1982, being section 552.503 of the
4 Michigan Compiled Laws.

5 (d) "Regulated occupation" means an occupation, profession,
6 or vocation which requires a license as a predicate for the prac-
7 tice of the occupation, profession, or vocation or for the use of
8 a specific title in the practice of the occupation, profession,
9 or vocation.

10 Sec. 3. An occupational regulatory agency shall suspend
11 pursuant to this act the license issued to an individual for a
12 regulated occupation.

13 Sec. 4. (1) Within 7 business days after receipt of a sus-
14 pension order issued pursuant to section 26a, 33, or 35 of the
15 support and visitation enforcement act, Act No. 295 of the Public
16 Acts of 1982, being sections 552.626a, 552.633, and 552.635 of
17 the Michigan Compiled Laws, an occupational regulatory agency
18 shall send a written notice of the receipt of the suspension
19 order to the licensee who is the subject of the suspension
20 order.

21 (2) The notice sent pursuant to subsection (1) shall inform
22 the licensee who is the subject of the suspension order that the
23 occupational regulatory agency shall comply with the suspension
24 order issued by a court and shall automatically suspend the
25 licensee's license within 28 days after the date of mailing of
26 the notice unless the office of the friend of the court provides

1 an order from the court indicating that the suspension order has
2 been rescinded.

3 Sec. 5. (1) An occupational regulatory agency shall comply
4 with a suspension order and shall suspend the license of a
5 licensee 28 days after the date of mailing of the notice pursuant
6 to section 4 unless the office of the friend of the court pro-
7 vides an order from a court indicating that the suspension order
8 has been rescinded.

9 (2) An order rescinding a suspension order is effective
10 immediately upon its entry by the court. An occupational regula-
11 tory agency shall reinstate the license of a licensee whose sus-
12 pension order is rescinded pursuant to section 26b(3), 33, or 35
13 of the support and visitation enforcement act, Act No. 295 of the
14 Public Acts of 1982, being sections 552.626b, 552.633, and
15 552.635 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. The effective date of
16 reinstatement of the license is considered to be the date of
17 entry of the order rescinding the suspension order.

18 (3) An occupational regulatory agency shall send a notice of
19 reinstatement of a license to the licensee within 7 business days
20 after receipt of the order rescinding the suspension order.

21 Sec. 6. This act shall not take effect unless all of the
22 following bills of the 87th Legislature are enacted into law:
