

HOUSE BILL No. 4546

EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

March 24, 1993, Introduced by Reps. McBryde, Oxender, Bender, Allen, Gilmer, Stille, Sikkema, Johnson, Middleton and Bobier and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of state police, and certain other state purposes for the fiscal years ending September 30, 1994 and September 30, 1995; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide for certain reports and the consideration of those reports; to provide for the disposition of other income received by the various state agencies; to provide testing of certain persons; to provide for certain emergency powers; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain committees, certain state agencies, and certain employees.

- 11 (b) Develop an operational policy to dispatch the closest unit, of 12 the appropriate type, to the service request.
- 13 (2) A county or group of counties which becomes ineligible
 14 pursuant to subsection (1) shall remain ineligible for a period
 15 commensurate with the period of noncompliance with subsection (1)
 16 except that the period of noncompliance shall not include
 17 noncompliance prior to October 1, 1994.
- 18 (3) This section shall only apply to counties which operate a 19 consolidated central dispatch under the provisions of Act No. 32 of 20 the Public Acts of 1986, as amended by Public Act 36 of 1988 and 21 Public Act 196 of 1991, being sections 484.1101 to 484.1707, 484.1102, 22 484.1311, 484.1319, 484.1401, 484.1601, and 484.1602 of the Michigan 23 Compiled Laws.

24 CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA CENTER

Sec. 1501. In addition to the funds appropriated in section 102, 26 the department may receive funds from local units of government for 27 the purpose of expanding or upgrading the law enforcement information 28 network, if the funds do not require state money for matching

- 1 purposes, or for continuing programs if the funds from local units of 2 government become unavailable.
- Sec. 1502. The \$989,400.00 appropriated in section 102 for a new 4 computer shall be used for the purchase, installation, and contract 5 maintenance of a new mainframe computer which shall be funded by LEIN 6 user fees sufficient to pay 1/3 of the purchase, installation, and 7 contract maintenance costs.
- 8 Sec. 1503. For the fiscal year ending September 30, 1995, the 9 department, in conjunction with the departments of social services, 10 transportation, secretary of state, and management and budget, shall 11 determine a cost of maintaining the traffic accident records program 12 based on each department's respective use.
- 13 Sec. 1504. (1) The funds appropriated in section 102 include 14 funds for the purchase of AFIS equipment.
- 15 (2) Funds expended by the department for the purchase of AFIS 16 equipment for local consortiums shall be on a per capita basis.
- 17 (3) State funds shall not be used in the operation or maintenance 18 of AFIS equipment for local consortiums.
- 19 (4) In addition to funds appropriated under section 102, the
 20 department may receive and expend funds from local units of government
 21 pursuant to section 7 of AFIS policy council act, Act No. 307 of the
 22 Public Acts of 1988, being section 28.157 of the Michigan Compiled
 23 Laws, for the purpose of acquiring equipment for the automated
 24 fingerprint identification system.
- Sec. 1505. From the \$3,265,200.00 appropriated in section 102 for 26 AFIS, an amount of not more than \$260,000.00 is appropriated for local 27 AFIS equipment and shall be used for the state share of local AFIS 28 equipment. The total state share for this purpose shall not exceed

- 1 \$1,660,000.00 over the 4-year lease-purchase period. The per capital 2 rate to be established by the AFIS policy council shall not exceed a
- 3 4-year total of \$41,000.00 per 100,000 population. State funds shall
- 4 be limited to the purchase of AFIS terminals that are on a 4-year
- 5 lease-purchase basis.

6 LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TRAINING COUNCIL

Sec. 1601. The funds appropriated to the law enforcement officers 8 training council for training to locals is provided in accordance with 9 a state reimbursement policy in which 50% of the determined state 10 reimbursement rate shall be distributed on the first day of enrollment 11 and 50% upon certification by the law enforcement officers training 12 council.

13 EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

- Sec. 1701. (1) The state director of emergency management may 15 expend funds appropriated under this act to call upon any agency or 16 department of the state or any resource of the state to protect life 17 or property or to provide for the health or safety of the population 18 in any area of the state in which the governor proclaims a state of 19 emergency or state of disaster under Act No. 302 of the Public Acts of 20 1945, being sections 10.31 to 10.33 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, or 21 under the emergency management act, Act No. 390 of the Public Acts of 22 1976, as amended, being sections 30.401 to 30.420 of the Michigan 23 Compiled Laws. The state director of emergency management may expend 24 the amounts the director considers necessary to accomplish these 25 purposes upon approval of the state budget director.
- 26 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in section 102, the 27 department may receive and expend funds from federal, local or private 28 sources for the purpose of providing emergency management training to

- 1 local or private interests.
- 2 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in section 102, the 3 department may receive or expend funds from federal, local, private, 4 or state sources for the purpose of supporting emergency preparedness 5 response recovery and mitigation activity.

6 UNIFORM SERVICES

- Sec. 1801. Upon service of proper notification by the department 8 of intent to cancel the lease at any post that is subject to 9 consolidation, funds appropriated in section 102 shall not be used for 10 rent expenses at that post beyond the minimum time required for 11 cancellation of the lease.
- Sec. 1802. It is the intent of the legislature that the
 13 department assist in the implementation of the St. Clair area crime
 14 stopper program and a crime stopper program for the law enforcement
 15 consortium consisting of Brownstone, Flat Rock, Gibraltar, Grosse Ile,
 16 Riverview, Rockwood, Trenton, and Woodhaven as a pilot project. The
 17 department shall provide training and staff support through the St.
 18 Clair state police post and the law enforcement consortium for the
 19 project.
- Sec. 1803. The department shall not expend any portion of the 21 funds appropriated in section 102 to plan for or to implement a 22 roadblock or check lane system that has as its primary objective the 23 deterrence or detection of intoxicated drivers in this state.

24 SPECIAL OPERATIONS

Sec. 1901. (1) Funds appropriated under section 102 for the state 26 police radio/state government network system shall be expended upon 27 approval of an expenditure plan by the department of management and 28 budget.
