

HOUSE BILL No. 4560

March 30, 1993, Introduced by Reps. Richard A. Young, Johnson, DeMars, Scott and Hollister and referred to the Committee on Public Retirement.

A bill to amend sections 1, 2, 3, and 4 of Act No. 325 of the Public Acts of 1978, entitled

"An act to provide for a suggestion awards program; and to prescribe the duties of the department of civil service,"

being sections 38.1161, 38.1162, 38.1163, and 38.1164 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Sections 1, 2, 3, and 4 of Act No. 325 of the
- 2 Public Acts of 1978, being sections 38.1161, 38.1162, 38.1163,
- 3 and 38.1164 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, are amended to read as
- 4 follows:
- 5 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 6 (a) "Board" means the suggestion awards board.
- (b) "Department" means the department of civil service.

- (c) "Director" means the director of the department.
- 2 (D) "RETIRED STATE EMPLOYEE" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO WAS A
- 3 STATE EMPLOYEE AND IS RECEIVING A RETIREMENT BENEFIT FROM THIS
- 4 STATE.
- 5 (E) (d) "State employee" means a classified or unclassi-
- 6 fied member of the state civil service or an unclassified
- 7 employee of the executive, legislative, or judicial branch of
- 8 state government.
- 9 Sec. 2. (1) The department may establish a suggestion
- 10 awards board within the department to consist of 5 members
- 11 appointed by the director. If established, the director shall
- 12 select the members from a list of state employees. Not more than
- 13 1 nominee shall be from the same state department.
- 14 (2) The terms of the members, except to fill vacancies
- 15 occurring other than by expiration of term, shall be 2 years from
- 16 the date of appointment. A vacancy in the office of a member,
- 17 occurring other than by expiration of term, shall be filled by
- 18 the director, or his OR HER designee, for the balance of the
- 19 term. Not more than I member shall be from the same state
- 20 department. The members shall elect a chairperson of the board.
- 21 (3) The board shall DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- (a) Develop a plan for evaluating suggestions made by state
- 23 employees OR RETIRED STATE EMPLOYEES, including the establishment
- 24 of guidelines for the type of award to be made within the limits
- 25 of section 5.

- (b) -Be PERFORM the final reviewer REVIEW of an award

 2 which THAT is greater than \$100.00 \$500.00 and of any

 3 suggestion which includes a grievance THAT IS APPEALED.
- (c) Prepare the rules for promulgation by the department under section 6 for the operation of the plan under subdivision 6 (a).
- Sec. 3. (1) If a board is established under section 2, the director shall appoint a suggestion administrator from the employees of the department.
- 10 (2) The suggestion administrator shall be responsible FOR 11 ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- (a) For the THE administrative supervision and promotion 13 of the suggestion awards program.
- 14 (b) For the THE final review of an award which THAT is 15 not greater than \$\frac{\$+00.00}{}\$ \$500.00 OR ITS EQUIVALENT.
- (c) For the THE submission of quarterly reports to the 17 appropriation committees in the house of representatives and the 18 senate, to the house and senate fiscal agencies, and to the 19 department of management and budget regarding the number and 20 nature of suggestions submitted and adopted, including the estimated savings involved with each suggestion adopted. The report 22 on an adopted suggestion having an estimated savings of 23 \$10,000.00 or more shall set forth the department, division, and
- 24 bureau affected; the situation which gave rise to the suggestion;
- 25 the proposed change; and analysis of the suggestion by the
- 26 affected department; the basis used in determining the savings;
- 27 and any other information which may be beneficial to the report.

- 1 (d) For the THE submission to the board OF a suggestion
- 2 -for which THAT is recommended FOR an award of more than
- 3 -\$100.00 \$500.00 or its equivalent.
- 4 (3) THE REPORT REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (2)(C) SHALL SET
- 5 FORTH ALL THE FOLLOWING ON AN ADOPTED SUGGESTION THAT HAS AN
- 6 ESTIMATED SAVINGS OF \$10,000.00 OR MORE:
- 7 (A) THE DEPARTMENT, DIVISION, AND BUREAU AFFECTED.
- 8 (B) THE SITUATION THAT GAVE RISE TO THE SUGGESTION.
- 9 (C) THE PROPOSED CHANGE AND ANALYSIS OF THE SUGGESTION BY
- 10 THE AFFECTED DEPARTMENT.
- (D) THE BASIS USED IN DETERMINING THE SAVINGS.
- (E) ANY OTHER INFORMATION THAT MAY BE CONSIDERED BENEFICIAL

- 14 Sec. 4. (1) If a board is established under section 2, the
- 15 head of each state department shall establish a committee to
- 16 consist of 3 WITH AN UNEVEN NUMBER OF members who are employees
- 17 of the state department and who -shall-be- ARE appointed by the
- 18 head of the state department. THE COMMITTEE SHALL HAVE NO LESS
- 19 THAN 3 MEMBERS AND NOT MORE THAN 11 MEMBERS BASED ON NEED AS
- 20 DETERMINED BY THE HEAD OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT. The committee
- 21 shall review the suggestions which THAT pertain to the opera-
- 22 tions of that state department.
- 23 (2) The committee, without undue delay, shall report to the
- 24 suggestion administrator concerning each suggestion submitted.
- 25 The report shall contain -an- ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 26 (A) AN analysis of the suggestion. -; the-

- (B) THE reasons for approval or disapproval. -; if
- 2 (C) IF approved, the estimated savings ; if approved, a
 3 AND recommended award. ; and any
- 4 (D) ANY other necessary information —which— THAT may be 5 required by this act or a rule promulgated under this act.
