



HOUSE BILL No. 4631

April 21, 1993, Introduced by Reps. Voorhees, Porreca, Richard A. Young and Gilmer and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations to the department of treasury for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993; and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 101. There is appropriated to the department of treasury to
2 supplement former appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30,
3 1993, from the following funds:

6 Sec. 201. In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of arti-
7 cle IX of the state constitution of 1963, total spending from state
8 resources in this appropriation act is \$5,200,000.00 and state appropria-
9 tions to be paid to units of local government in section 101 are
10 \$5,200,000.00.

11 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized under
12 this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards, offices, and
13 programs for which an appropriation is made under this act are subject to
14 Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594
15 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

16 Sec. 301. The state shall reimburse each county, city, and township
17 for the cost of conducting the special election to be held June 2, 1993
18 in the amounts and in the manner as stated in this section. Payments
19 shall not exceed the actual cost of the election. Payments shall be made
20 upon presentation and approval of a verified account of actual costs to
21 the department of state, elections division. Reimbursable costs shall
22 not include salaries of local officials or employees other than temporary
23 local employees; county and local employees or officials that have been
24 given election day off from work with pay and do not work on election
25 business; and costs of reusable supplies and equipment. A county, city,
26 or township shall not be reimbursed for its costs of conducting the
27 special election if the county, city, or township by action of the

1 legislative body of the jurisdiction places or causes to be placed
2 another question on the ballot at the special election. Costs not in
3 compliance with this section shall be disapproved. To qualify for reim-
4 bursement, a county, city, or township shall submit its verified account
5 of actual costs within 60 days after the date of the special election.
6 The state treasurer shall issue a payment to a county, city, or township
7 from the appropriation in section 101 after the secretary of state has
8 notified the state treasurer of the approved amount.
