

HOUSE BILL No. 4663

April 27, 1993, Introduced by Reps. Rivers, Wallace, Dobronski, Gire, DeMars, Agee, Saunders, Harrison, Jondahl, Joe Young, Jr., Stallworth, Willard, Schroer, Curtis, Yokich, Baade, Byrum, Barns and Leland and referred to the Committee on Local Government.

A bill to amend sections 758, 759, 759b, and 769 of Act No. 116 of the Public Acts of 1954, entitled "Michigan election law,"

section 759 as amended by Act No. 201 of the Public Acts of 1982, being sections 168.758, 168.759, 168.759b, and 168.769 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Sections 758, 759, 759b, and 769 of Act No. 116
- 2 of the Public Acts of 1954, section 759 as amended by Act No. 201
- 3 of the Public Acts of 1982, being sections 168.758, 168.759,
- 4 168.759b, and 168.769 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, are amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- Sec. 758. -(1) For the purposes of AS USED IN this act,
- 7 "absent voter" means a qualified and registered elector. : (a)
- 8 Who, on account of physical disability, cannot without another's

- 1 assistance attend the polls on the day of an election. (b) Who,
- 2 on account of the tenets of his religion, cannot attend the polls
- 3 on the day of election: (c) Who cannot attend the polls on the
- 4 day of an election in the precinct in which he resides because of
- 5 being an election precinct inspector in another precinct. (d)
- 6 Who is 60 years of age or more. (e) Who is absent or expects to
- 7 be absent from the township or city in which he or she resides
- 8 during the entire period the polls are open for voting on the day
- 9 of an election. (f) Who cannot attend the polls on election day
- 10 because of being confined in jail awaiting arraignment or trial.
- 11 (2) Subsection (1) shall not be applicable to ABSENT VOTER DOES
- 12 NOT INCLUDE a person who -has moved MOVES to another state,
- 13 regardless of length of residence therein IN THAT STATE, and
- 14 who no longer maintains an actual A residence in Michigan
- 15 THIS STATE. The storage of personal effects or household goods,
- 16 the ownership of property which THAT is rented or leased to
- 17 others, or occasional brief visits to a former Michigan domicile
- 18 while residing elsewhere for most of the year shall DO not con-
- 19 stitute a residence for voting purposes in this state, except as
- 20 defined in section 1 of article $\frac{2}{2}$ II of the state constitution
- 21 of 1963 and statutes enacted thereunder, UNDER THAT SECTION and
- 22 except IN THE CASE OF former residents of -Michigan THIS STATE
- 23 domiciled in the District of Columbia or —to—former
- 24 residents who are serving in the United States army, navy, mer-
- 25 chant marine, marine corps, or air force.
- 26 Sec. 759. (1) At any time during the 75 days preceding
- 27 BEFORE a primary or special primary, but not later than 2 p.m. of

- the Saturday immediately before the primary or special primary,
- 2 -a voter AN ELECTOR who qualifies to vote as an absent voter, as
- 3 defined in section 758, may apply -to- FOR AN ABSENT VOTER
- A RALLOT. THE ELECTOR SHALL APPLY IN PERSON OR BY MAIL WITH THE
- 5 CLERK OF the township, city, or village -clerk, either in person
- 6 or by mail, to vote absentee IN WHICH THE ELECTOR IS
- 7 REGISTERED. An application received before a primary or special
- 8 primary may be for either that primary only, or for that primary
- g and the election -which THAT follows.
- (2) At EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (1), AT any time
- 11 during the 75 days preceding any other BEFORE AN election, but
- 12 not later than 2 p.m. of the Saturday before the election, -a
- 13 voter AN ELECTOR who qualifies to vote as an absent voter, as
- 14 defined in section 758, may apply -to- FOR AN ABSENT VOTER
- 15 BALLOT. THE ELECTOR SHALL APPLY IN PERSON OR BY MAIL WITH THE
- 16 CLERK OF the township, city, or village clerk, either in person
- 17 or by mail, to vote absentee IN WHICH THE VOTER IS REGISTERED.
- 18 (3) An application FOR AN ABSENT VOTER BALLOT under this
- 19 section may be made in any of the following ways:
- 20 (a) By a written request signed by the -voter stating the
- 21 statutory grounds for making the application ELECTOR.
- 22 (b) On an ABSENT VOTER BALLOT application form provided for
- 23 that purpose by the clerk of the city, township, or village.
- 24 (c) On a federal postcard application.
- 25 (4) The clerk of the city, township, or village shall have
- 26 ABSENT VOTER BALLOT application forms available in the office of
- 27 the clerk at all times and shall furnish an ABSENT VOTER BALLOT

       (5) A person who makes a false statement in an ABSENT VOTER
21
22 BALLOT application -for an absent voter's ballot is guilty of a
23 misdemeanor.
       Sec. 759b. (1) Any A registered elector may apply for AN
24
25 absent voter -ballots - BALLOT at any time -prior to BEFORE 4
26 p.m. on election day if he shall have become physically dis
27 abled or shall be absent from the city or township because of
28 sickness or death in the family which AN EVENT has occurred at a
29 time -which has- THAT made it impossible to apply for absent
30 voter ballots by the statutory deadline. The application shall
31 be called an emergency absent voter BALLOT application.
       (2) Emergency absent voter BALLOT applications may be made

33 by letter or on a form provided by the clerk. The application
34 shall set forth that the voter is qualified to vote in the

- 1 election -, stating the statutory reason for applying for an
- 2 emergency absent voter ballot and that the reason for applying
- 3 after the statutory deadline AN EVENT occurred at such a time to
- 4 make it impossible to file an application for AN absent voter
- 5 -ballots BALLOT by the statutory deadline.
- 6 (3) Any A person intentionally making a false statement in
- 7 -such AN EMERGENCY ABSENT VOTER BALLOT application is guilty of
- 8 a felony. Any A person aiding or abetting any ANOTHER person
- 9 to make a false statement on such IN AN EMERGENCY ABSENT VOTER
- 10 BALLOT application is guilty of a felony.
- 11 (4) Upon receipt by the clerk of a valid application for an
- 12 emergency absent voter ballot, the clerk may deliver the ABSENT
- 13 VOTER ballots to the applicant in person, through a deputy or an
- 14 election assistant, or the may deliver them at his OR HER office
- 15 to a person named by the applicant in the EMERGENCY ABSENT VOTER
- 16 BALLOT application. The ABSENT voter -may SHALL return the bal-
- 17 lots to the clerk in the sealed envelope provided -therefor FOR
- 18 THAT REASON. THE ABSENT VOTER MAY RETURN THE ABSENT VOTER BAL-
- 19 LOTS TO THE CLERK in any manner. he sees fit. To HOWEVER, TO
- 20 be valid, THE ABSENT VOTER ballots -must SHALL be returned to
- 21 the clerk in time to be delivered to the polls -prior to BEFORE
- 22 8 p.m. on election day.
- Sec. 769. (1) The provisions of this chapter -shall DO
- 24 not be construed so as to prohibit any AN absent voter
- 25 returning to his place of residence, from voting in person
- 26 within his OR HER precinct at any regular or special election or
- 27 official primary AN election, notwithstanding that he may have

- 1 made application OR SHE APPLIES for an absent voter's VOTER
 2 ballot and the same may have been BALLOT IS mailed by the
 3 said clerk. Provided, That such voter has not availed him
 4 self of
- (2) SUBSECTION (1) APPLIES ONLY IF THE ELECTOR DOES NOT

 6 EXERCISE the privileges of an absent voter, as provided by this

 7 chapter and voted any such— VOTE AN ABSENT VOTER ballot

 8 mailed him— by the said— clerk, and provided also that he— IF

 9 THE ELECTOR returns such— THE ballot or ballots if— received

 10 to the board of inspectors of election in his OR HER

 11 precinct. In case any— IF AN absent voter ballot is so

 12 returned, it shall, by said— THE board be marked "cancelled"

 13 and placed— SHALL MARK IT "CANCELED" AND PLACE IT in the regular

 14 box with other cancelled— CANCELED ballots. Any voter—

 15 (3) A PERSON voting at any— AN election, both in person and

 16 by means of an absent voter ballot, or who— shall attempt—

 17 ATTEMPTS so to vote, shall, on conviction, be deemed— IS guilty

18 of a felony.
