

## **HOUSE BILL No. 4822**

June 2, 1993, Introduced by Rep. Griffin and referred to the Committee on State Affairs.

A bill to amend section 2 of Act No. 390 of the Public Acts of 1976, entitled as amended

"Emergency management act,"

as amended by Act No. 50 of the Public Acts of 1990, being section 30.402 of the Michigan Compiled Laws; and to add section 411a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Section 2 of Act No. 390 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1976, as amended by Act No. 50 of the Public Acts of 1990, being
- 3 section 30.402 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended and sec-
- 4 tion 411a is added to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 6 (A) "BUILDING INSPECTION OFFICIAL" MEANS AN APPOINTED OR
- 7 ELECTED FEDERAL, STATE, OR LOCAL OFFICIAL WITH OVERALL EXECUTIVE '
- 8 RESPONSIBILITY TO COORDINATE BUILDING INSPECTION IN THE

- I JURISDICTION IN WHICH THE STATE OF DISASTER OR EMERGENCY IS
- 2 DECLARED.
- 3 (B) -(a) "Chief executive official" means:
- 4 (i) In the case of FOR a county with an elected county
- 5 executive, the county executive.
- 6 (ii) In the case of FOR a county without an elected county
- 7 executive, the chairperson of the county board of commissioners
- 8 -- or the appointed administrator designated by appropriate ena-
- 9 bling legislation.
- 10 (iii) In the case of FOR a city, the mayor or the individ-
- 11 ual specifically identified in the municipal charter.
- 12 (iv) In the case of FOR a township, the township
- 13 supervisor.
- (v) In the case of FOR a village, the village president or
- 15 the individual specifically identified in the village charter.
- (C) (b) "Council" means the Michigan emergency management
- 17 advisory council.
- 18 (D) -(c) "Department" means the department of state
- 19 police.
- 20 (E) (d) "Director" or "state director of emergency
- 21 management" means the director of the department of state police
- 22 or his or her designee.
- 23 (F) (e) "Disaster" means an occurrence or threat of wide-
- 24 spread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property
- 25 resulting from a natural or human-made cause, including, but not
- 26 limited to, fire, flood, snowstorm, ice storm, tornado,
- 27 windstorm, wave action, oil spill, water contamination, utility

- I failure, hazardous peacetime radiological incident, major
- 2 transportation accident, hazardous materials incident, epidemic,
- 3 air contamination, blight, drought, infestation, explosion, or
- 4 hostile military action or paramilitary action, or similar occur-
- 5 rences resulting from terrorist activities, riots, or civil
- 6 disorders.
- 7 (G)  $\frac{(f)}{(f)}$  "Disaster relief forces" means  $\frac{-all}{(f)}$  agencies of
- 8 state, county, and municipal government, private and volunteer
- 9 personnel, public officers and employees, and all other persons
- 10 or groups of persons having duties or responsibilities under this
- 11 act or pursuant to a lawful order or directive authorized by this
- 12 act.
- (H) (g) "District coordinator" means the state police
- 14 emergency management division district coordinator.
- 15 (I) -(h)- "Emergency" means -any- AN occasion or instance in
- 16 which the governor determines state assistance is needed to sup-
- 17 plement local efforts and capabilities to save lives, TO protect
- 18 property and the public health and safety, or to lessen or avert
- 19 the threat of a catastrophe in any part of the state.
- 20 (J) (i) "Emergency management coordinator" means a person
- 21 appointed pursuant to section 9 to coordinate emergency manage-
- 22 ment within the county or municipality. Emergency management
- 23 coordinator includes a civil défense director, civil defense
- 24 coordinator, emergency services coordinator, emergency program
- 25 manager, or other person with a similar title and duties.
- 26 (K) -(j) "Local state of emergency" means a proclamation or
- 27 declaration that activates the response and recovery aspects of

- 1 any and all applicable local or interjurisdictional emergency
- 2 operations plans and authorizes the furnishing of aid, assist-
- 3 ance, and directives under those plans.
- 4  $(\ell)$  "Michigan emergency management plan" means the
- 5 plan prepared and maintained by the emergency management division
- 6 of the department and signed by the governor.
- 7 (M) (M) (Municipality means a city, village, or
- 8 township.
- 9 (N) -(m) "Person" means an individual, partnership, corpo-
- 10 ration, association, governmental entity, or any other entity.
- (0) -(n) "Political subdivision" means a county, municipal-
- 12 ity, school district, or any other governmental unit, agency,
- 13 body, board, or commission which THAT is not a state depart-
- 14 ment, board, commission, or agency of state government.
- (P) -(o)- "Rule" means a rule promulgated pursuant to the
- 16 administrative procedures act of 1969, Act No. 306 of the Public
- 17 Acts of 1969, being sections 24.201 to 24.328 of the Michigan
- 18 Compiled Laws.
- 19 (Q) (p) "State of disaster" means an executive order or
- 20 proclamation that activates the disaster response and recovery
- 21 aspects of the state, local, and interjurisdictional emergency
- 22 operations plans applicable to the counties or municipalities
- 23 affected.
- 24 (R) -(q) "State of emergency" means an executive order or
- 25 proclamation that activates the emergency response and recovery
- 26 aspects of the state, local, and interjurisdictional emergency

- I operations plans applicable to the counties or municipalities
- 2 affected.
- 3 SEC. 411A. A PERSON LICENSED AS A PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER
- 4 UNDER ARTICLE 20 OF THE OCCUPATIONAL CODE, ACT NO. 299 OF THE
- 5 PUBLIC ACTS OF 1980, BEING SECTIONS 339.2001 TO 399.2014 OF THE
- 6 MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS, IS NOT LIABLE FOR CIVIL DAMAGES AS A
- 7 RESULT OF AN ACT OR OMISSION IN THE PERFORMANCE OF STRUCTURAL,
- 8 ELECTRICAL, MECHANICAL, OR OTHER ENGINEERING SERVICES PROVIDED AT
- 9 THE SCENE OF AN EMERGENCY IF THOSE SERVICES ARE PROVIDED VOLUN-
- 10 TARILY, WITHOUT COMPENSATION, AND AT THE REQUEST OF THE BUILDING
- 11 INSPECTION OFFICIAL, CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER, DIRECTOR, DISTRICT
- 12 COORDINATOR, OR EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR. THE IMMUNITY
- 13 PROVIDED BY THIS SECTION IS IN ADDITION TO OTHER IMMUNITY PRO-
- 14 VIDED BY THIS ACT OR OTHER LAW.
