

# **HOUSE BILL No. 5262**

## EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

December 23, 1993, Introduced by Reps. Richard A. Young, Middleton, McBryde, Walberg, Stille, Gilmer, Allen and Bobier and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of military affairs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1995; to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; to provide for certain duties of the department of military affairs, other state agencies, and local units of government; and to provide for the preparation of certain reports.

#### THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 101. There is appropriated for the department of military 2 affairs, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1995, from the funds 3 identified as follows:

Sec. 201. (1) In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of					
26 article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending in					
27 this bill is \$49,825,600.00 and state spending to units of local

- 3 (2) When it appears to the director of the department that state
  4 spending to local units of government will be less than the amount that
  5 was projected to be expended for any quarter, the director shall
  6 immediately give notice of the approximate shortfall to the department
  7 of management and budget, the senate and house appropriations
- 9 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and the expenditures authorized 10 under this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards, 11 offices, and programs for which an appropriation is made under this act 12 are subject to the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public 13 Acts of 1984, being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan 14 Compiled Laws.
- 15 Sec. 203. As used in this act:
- 16 (a) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.
- 17 (b) "IDT" means intradepartmental transfer.
- 18 (c) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.

8 committees, and the senate and house fiscal agencies.

- 19 (d) "FTE" means full-time equated.
- Sec. 204. The amounts appropriated for utilities and that portion 21 of contractual services, supplies, and materials used to pay for 22 utility service to state facilities in section 101 may be expended in a 23 manner consistent with the provisions of section 253 of the management 24 and budget act, Act 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section 25 18.1253 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- Sec. 205. (1) Pursuant to the department of military affairs

  27 provisions of civil service rules and regulations and applicable

  28 collective bargaining agreements, individuals seeking employment with

  29 the department shall submit to a controlled substance test administered

1 by the department.

- 2 (2) Individuals seeking employment with the department of military 3 affairs who refuse to take a controlled substance test or who test 4 positive for the illicit use of a controlled substance on such a test 5 shall be denied employment by the department for a minimum of 1 year.
- Sec. 206. (1) Beginning October 1, 1994, there shall be a hiring 7 freeze imposed on the state classified civil service. State departments 8 and agencies shall be prohibited from hiring any new full-time state 9 classified civil service employees and prohibited from filling any 10 vacant state classified civil service positions. This hiring freeze 11 does not apply to internal transfers from one position to another 12 within a department or to positions that are funded 80% or more from 13 federal or restricted funds.
- 14 (2) The director of the department of management and budget shall
  15 grant exceptions to this hiring freeze when the director believes that
  16 such a hiring freeze will result in rendering a state department or
  17 agency unable to deliver basic services. The director of the department
  18 of management and budget shall report by the fifteenth of each month to
  19 the chairpersons of the senate and house appropriations committees the
  20 number of exclusions to the hiring freeze approved during the previous
  21 month and the reasons to justify the exclusion.
- Sec 207. In addition to the funds appropriated in section 101, 23 there is hereby appropriated such federal, local or private funds as 24 the department may be eligible to receive up to a total of \$2,000,000. 25 These funds shall not be available for expenditure unless transferred 26 to a line item in this act in compliance with the applicable provisions 27 of section 393 of the management and budget act, Act 431 of the Public 28 Acts of 1984, being section 18.1393 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 29 Sec. 208. From the funds appropriated in section 101, the

1 department may make grants in support of the Michigan neighborhood 2 partnership to non-profit organizations for purposes consistent with 3 the purposes of the line-item appropriation from which the grant is 4 made. The total of such grants made by the department may not exceed 5 \$50,000.

#### 6 DEPARTMENTWIDE APPROPRIATIONS

- Sec 301. Funds appropriated in section 101 for the military duty 8 contingency fund shall be used to fund nonfederally supported missions 9 of the national guard when called to state duty.
- Sec. 302. The Michigan veterans' memorial park commission may 10 11 receive and expend gifts, contributions, and bequests from any person, 12 public or private corporation, organization, foundation, governmental 13 entity, or any other source for the purpose of establishing a veterans' 14 memorial park as described in Executive Order No. 1992-12. Money 15 contributed to the Michigan veterans' memorial park commission shall be 16 deposited in the state treasury through the department of military 17 affairs and shall be available for expenditure. Project costs hereby 18 authorized shall not exceed the gifts, contributions, and bequests 19 received. Money under this section and any specific work orders or 20 projects adopted by the Michigan veterans' memorial park commission in 21 accordance with section 451(4) of the management and budget act, Act 22 No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section 18.1451 of the 23 Michigan Compiled Laws, shall not lapse at the end of this fiscal year 24 but shall be available for expenditure until September 30, 1996. 25 Expenditures shall be in accordance with methods and procedures 26 approved by the Michigan veterans' memorial park commission, the 27 department of military affairs, and appropriate state agencies. Sec. 303. Funds available from the Michigan national guard armory 28

29 construction fund created in section 382a of the Michigan military act,

1 Act No. 150 of the Public Acts of 1967, being section 32.782a of the 2 Michigan Compiled Laws, are hereby appropriated for expenditure for the 3 purposes specified in section 382a of Act No. 150 of the Public Acts of 4 1967.

## 5 VETERANS SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS

- 6 Sec. 401. (1) The amount appropriated in section 101 for grants to 7 veterans service organizations shall be used only for salaries, wages, 8 related personnel costs, training, and equipment for accredited veteran 9 service advocacy officers and necessary support and managerial staff. 10 Training shall be provided for service advocacy officers and shall be 11 conducted by accredited advocacy officers.
- (2) To receive a grant from the funds appropriated in section 101, 13 a veterans service organization shall meet the following eligibility 14 requirements:
- 15 (a) Be congressionally chartered by the United States congress.
- 16 (b) Be an active participating member of the Michigan veterans
  17 organizations' rehabilitation and veterans service committee and abide
  18 by its rules, guidelines, and programs.
- 19 (c) Demonstrate the receipt of monetary or service support from 20 its own organization.
- 21 (d) Comply with the department of military affairs' and
  22 legislature's requirements of accounting audits, service work activity,
  23 accounting of recoveries, listing of volunteer hours, budget requests,
  24 and other requirements specified in subsection (3).
- (e) For a veterans service organization founded after September 26 30, 1989, be in operation and providing service to Michigan veterans 27 for not less than 2 years prior to receiving an initial state grant. 28 During this 2-year period of time, the organization shall file a 29 listing of service work activity and an accounting of recoveries with

- 1 the department of military affairs, senate and house fiscal agencies, 2 and the senate and house subcommittees on military affairs on forms as 3 described by the department.
- (3) A veterans service organization receiving a grant from the 5 funds appropriated in section 101 shall file with the department of 6 military affairs a certified accounting of its expenditures within 120 7 days after the organization's fiscal year end. Each organization shall 8 provide a detailed budget request for the fiscal year ending September 930, 1995 to the department by November 15, 1994 within the format as 10 described by the department to be used in the development of the budget 11 ending September 30, 1995. Each organization shall provide 5 copies of 12 a listing of all service activity, an accounting of recoveries, and a 13 listing of volunteer hours for the fiscal year ending September 30, 14 1994 to the department by January 31, 1995. A veterans service 15 organization receiving a grant from the funds appropriated in section 16 101 shall use the forms recommended by the Michigan veterans 17 organizations' rehabilitation and veterans service committee for filing 18 reports required by this act. The department shall forward information 19 required under this section to the senate and house fiscal agencies and 20 to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on military 21 affairs.
- Sec. 402. It is the intent of the legislature that funds

  23 appropriated in section 101 for veterans service organizations shall

  24 include funding to provide services to veterans of World War I.

### 25 GRAND RAPIDS VETERANS' FACILITY

Sec. 501. The funds appropriated in section 101 for the board of 27 managers may be expended for facility improvements, the purchase and 28 repair of equipment and furnishings, member services, and other 29 purposes that benefit the Grand Rapids veterans' facility.

## 1 D. J. JACOBETTI VETERANS' FACILITY

Sec. 601. The funds appropriated in section 101 for the board of managers may be expended for facility improvements, the purchase and repair of equipment and furnishings, member services, and other purposes that benefit the D. J. Jacobetti veterans' facility.
