



HOUSE BILL No. 5265

EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

December 23, 1993, Introduced by Reps. Owen, McBryde, Middleton, Walberg, Stille, Oxender, Gilmer, Allen and Bobier and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of state police, and certain other state purposes for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1995; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide for certain reports and the consideration of those reports; to provide for the disposition of other income received by the various state agencies; to provide testing of certain persons; to provide for certain emergency powers; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain committees, certain state agencies, and certain employees.

23 (2) When it appears to the director of the department that state
 24 spending to local units of government will be less than the amount that
 25 was projected to be expended for any quarter, the director shall
 26 immediately give notice of the approximate shortfall to the department
 27 of management and budget, the senate and house appropriations
 28 committees, and the senate and house fiscal agencies.

29 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and the expenditures authorized

1 under this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards,
2 offices, and programs for which an appropriation is made under this act
3 are subject to the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public
4 Acts of 1984, being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan
5 Compiled Laws.

6 Sec. 203. As used in this act:

- 7 (a) "AFIS" means automated fingerprint identification system.
- 8 (b) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.
- 9 (c) "IDT" means intradepartmental transfer.
- 10 (d) "D.A.R.E." means drug abuse resistance education.
- 11 (e) "DEA" means drug enforcement administration.
- 12 (f) "Department" means the department of state police.
- 13 (g) "DMB" means the Michigan department of management and budget.
- 14 (h) "DOJ" means the United States department of justice.
- 15 (i) "DOT" means the United States department of transportation.
- 16 (j) "DOT-FHWA" means DOT-federal highway administration.
- 17 (k) "DOT-HMTUSA" means DOT-hazardous materials transportation
18 uniform safety act.
- 19 (l) "DOT-NHTSA" means DOT-national highway traffic safety
20 administration.

6 Sec. 204. The amounts appropriated for utilities and that portion
7 of contractual services, supplies, and materials used to pay for
8 utility service to state facilities in section 101 may be expended in a
9 manner consistent with the provisions of section 253 of the management
10 and budget act, Act 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section
11 18.1253 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

12 Sec. 205. It is the desire of the legislature that personnel of
13 the department and vendors who request, and are eligible for,
14 reimbursement of expenses related to the operation of the department be
15 reimbursed from the appropriations provided in section 101 within 30
16 days after submitting a request, or the eligible personnel shall be
17 paid an additional amount equal to 0.75% of the payment due as provided
18 in section 4 of Act No. 279 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section
19 17.54 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. The department shall pay an
20 additional amount equal to 0.75% of the payment due for the first month
21 and each succeeding month or portion of a month the payment remains
22 past due as provided in section 4 of Act No. 279 of the Public Acts of
23 1984.

24 Sec. 206. To avoid the overexpenditure of funds appropriated under
25 this act, the department beginning June 1, 1995 shall report quarterly
26 to the state police subcommittees of the senate and house
27 appropriations committees the current status of the accounts set forth
28 in section 101 on forms prescribed by the house and senate fiscal
29 agencies and the department.

1 Sec. 207. The department shall, on November 1, 1994, and April 1,
2 1995, report to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on
3 state police and to the senate and house fiscal agencies, the number of
4 authorized position vacancies by appropriation unit and major program
5 area within the department. The reports shall be submitted within 15
6 days after the last pay period in each quarter.

7 Sec. 208. (1) Beginning October 1, 1994, there shall be a hiring
8 freeze imposed on the state classified civil service. State
9 departments and agencies shall be prohibited from hiring any new
10 full-time state classified civil service employees and prohibited from
11 filling any vacant state classified civil service positions. This
12 hiring freeze does not apply to internal transfers from one position to
13 another within a department or to positions that are funded 80% or more
14 from federal or restricted funds.

15 (2) The director of the department of management and budget shall
16 grant exceptions to this hiring freeze when the director believes that
17 the hiring freeze will result in rendering a state department or agency
18 unable to deliver basic services. The director of the department of
19 management and budget shall report by the fifteenth of each month to
20 the chairpersons of the senate and house appropriations committees the
21 number of exclusions to the hiring freeze approved during the previous
22 month and the reasons to justify the exclusion.

23 Sec. 209. In addition to the funds appropriated in section 101,
24 there is hereby appropriated such federal, local, or private funds as
25 the department may be eligible to receive up to a total of
26 \$7,000,000.00. These funds shall not be available for expenditure
27 unless transferred to a line item in this act in compliance with the
28 applicable provisions of section 393 of the management and budget act,
29 Act 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section 18.1393 of the

1 Michigan Compiled Laws.

2 Sec. 210. From the funds appropriated in section 101, the
3 department may make grants in support of the Michigan neighborhood
4 partnership to non-profit organizations for purposes consistent with
5 the purposes of the line-item appropriation from which the grant is
6 made. The total of such grants made by the department may not exceed
7 \$50,000.

8 **DEPARTMENTWIDE APPROPRIATIONS**

9 Sec. 301. Money shall not be expended by the department to hire or
10 train an applicant for employment by the department unless that
11 applicant agrees in writing to submit to a controlled substance test
12 that is supervised by the department.

13 **CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA CENTER**

14 Sec. 401. In addition to the funds appropriated in section 101,
15 the department may receive funds from local units of government to
16 expand or upgrade the law enforcement information network, if the funds
17 do not require state money for matching purposes, or for continuing
18 programs if the funds from local units of government become
19 unavailable.

20 Sec. 402. The funds appropriated in section 101 for computer
21 services shall be funded by LEIN user fees sufficient to pay 1/3 of the
22 service and contract maintenance costs.

23 Sec. 403. For the fiscal year ending September 30, 1995, the
24 department, in conjunction with the departments of social services,
25 transportation, secretary of state, and management and budget, shall
26 determine a cost of maintaining the traffic accident records program
27 based on each department's respective use.

28 Sec. 404. (1) The funds appropriated in section 101 include funds
29 for the purchase of AFIS equipment.

1 (2) Funds expended by the department for the purchase of AFIS
2 equipment for local consortiums shall be on a per capita basis.

3 (3) State funds shall not be used in the operation or maintenance
4 of AFIS equipment for local consortiums.

5 (4) In addition to funds appropriated under section 101, the
6 department may receive and expend funds from local units of government
7 pursuant to section 7 of the AFIS policy council act, Act No. 307 of
8 the Public Acts of 1988, being section 28.157 of the Michigan Compiled
9 Laws, for the purpose of acquiring equipment for the automated
10 fingerprint identification system.

11 **LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TRAINING COUNCIL**

12 Sec. 501. (1) The funds appropriated to the law enforcement
13 officers training council for maintenance and delivery of training to
14 locals is provided in accordance with a state reimbursement policy in
15 which 100% of the determined state reimbursement rate shall be
16 distributed upon certification by the law enforcement officers training
17 council.

18 (2) Funds shall not be expended by MLEOTC for training a law
19 enforcement officer candidate, and a candidate shall not be certified
20 by the MLEOTC, unless the candidate tests negative on a test prescribed
21 by the MLEOTC that is designed to detect the illegal use of controlled
22 substances. A test shall be conducted before basic training and before
23 application for certification. A candidate who tests positive or
24 refuses to submit to a test is not eligible for MLEOTC training or
25 certification until the expiration of 2 years after the positive test
26 or the refusal to submit to the test. Funds shall not be expended to
27 employ, train, or certify a candidate who tests positive or who refuses
28 a test, until the expiration of 2 years after the positive test or the
29 refusal to submit to the test.

1 EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

2 Sec. 601. (1) The state director of emergency management may
3 expend funds appropriated under this act to call upon any agency or
4 department of the state or any resource of the state to protect life or
5 property or to provide for the health or safety of the population in
6 any area of the state in which the governor proclaims a state of
7 emergency or state of disaster under Act No. 302 of the Public Acts of
8 1945, being sections 10.31 to 10.33 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, or
9 under the emergency management act, Act No. 390 of the Public Acts of
10 1976 as amended, being sections 30.401 to 30.420 of the Michigan
11 Compiled Laws. The state director of emergency management may expend
12 the amounts the director considers necessary to accomplish these
13 purposes. The director shall submit to the state budget director as
14 soon as possible a complete report of all actions taken under the
15 authority of this section. The report shall contain, as a separate
16 item, a statement of all funds expended that are not reimbursable from
17 federal funds. The state budget director shall review the expenditures
18 and submit recommendations to the legislature in regard to any possible
19 need for a supplemental appropriation.

20 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in section 101, the
21 department may receive and expend funds from local, private, federal,
22 or state sources for the purpose of providing emergency management
23 training to local or private interests.

24 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in section 101, the
25 department may receive or expend funds from local, private, federal, or
26 state sources for the purpose of supporting emergency preparedness,
27 response, recovery, and mitigation activity.

28 UNIFORM SERVICES

29 Sec. 701. The department shall not expend any portion of the funds

1 appropriated in section 101, including any expenditure made pursuant to
2 an executive order, to plan for or to implement a roadblock or
3 checklane system that has as its primary objective the deterrence or
4 detection of intoxicated drivers in this state.

5 Sec. 702. Upon service of proper notification by the department of
6 its intent to cancel the lease at any post that is subject to
7 consolidation, funds appropriated in section 101 shall not be used for
8 rent expenses at that post beyond the minimum time required for
9 cancellation of the lease.

10 **SPECIAL OPERATIONS**

11 Sec. 801. Funds appropriated under section 101 for the state
12 police radio/state government network system shall be expended upon
13 approval of an expenditure plan by the department of management and
14 budget.
