A bill to amend sections 102 and 207a of Act No 179 of the Public Acts of 1991, entitled

Michigan telecommunications act,

being sections 484 2102 and 484 2207a of the Michigan Compiled Laws and to add sections 317 and 318

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT

- Section 1 Sections 102 and 207a of Act No 179 of the
- 2 Public Acts of 1991, being sections 484 2102 and 484 2207a of the
- 3 Michigan Compiled Laws are amended and sections 317 and 318 are
- 4 added to read as follows
- 5 Sec 102 As used in this act
- 6 (a) Access means the provision of access to a local
- 7 exchange network for the purpose of enabling a provider to
- 8 originate or terminate telecommunications service within the
- 9 exchange

- 1 (b) Basic local exchange service means the provision of an
- 2 access line and usage within a local calling area for the trans-
- 3 mission of high-quality 2-way interactive switched voice or data
- 4 communication
- 5 (c) 'Commission" means the Michigan public service
- 6 commission
- 7 (d) 'Contested case or case means a proceeding as defined
- 8 in section 3 of the administrative procedures act of 1969, Act
- 9 No 306 of the Public Acts of 1969, being section 24 203 of the
- 10 Michigan Compiled Laws
- (e) Educational institution means a public educational
- 12 institution or a private non-profit educational institution
- 13 approved by the department of education in this state authorized
- 14 to provide a program of primary secondary or higher education
- 15 or a nonprofit association or consortium whose primary purpose is
- 16 education A nonprofit association or consortium under this sub-
- 17 division shall consist of 2 or more of the following
- 18 (1) Public educational institutions
- 19 (11) Nonprofit educational institutions approved by the
- 20 department of education
- 21 (111) The state board of education
- 22 (10) Telecommunication providers
- 23 (v) A nonprofit association of educational institutions or
- 24 consortium of educational institutions
- 25 (f) Exchange' means 1 or more contiguous central offices
- 26 and all associated facilities within a geographical area in which

- 1 local exchange telecommunications services are offered by a
- 2 provider
- 3 (g) Handicapper means a person who has 1 or more of the
- 4 following physical characteristics
- 5 (1) Blindness
- 6 (11) Inability to ambulate more than 200 feet without having
- 7 to stop and rest during any time of the year
- 8 (111) Loss of use of 1 or both legs or feet
- 9 (iv) Inability to ambulate without the prolonged use of a
- 10 wheelchair, walker, crutches braces, or other device required to
- 11 and mobility
- (v) A lung disease from which the person's expiratory volume
- 13 for 1 second when measured by spirometry, is less than 1 liter
- 14 or from which the person's arterial oxygen tension is less than
- 15 60 mm/hg of room air at rest
- 16 (vi) A cardiovascular disease from which the person measures
- 17 between 3 and 4 on the New York heart classification scale or
- 18 from which a marked limitation of physical activity causes
- 19 fatigue palpitation dyspnea or anginal pain
- 20 (vii) Other diagnosed disease or disorder including, but not
- 21 limited to, severe arthritis or a neurological or orthopedic
- 22 impairment that creates a severe mobility limitation
- 23 (h) 'Information services or enhanced services means the
- 24 offering of a capability for generating acquiring, storing,
- 25 transforming, processing, retrieving, utilizing, or making avail-
- 26 able information that is conveyed by telecommunications
- 27 Information or enhanced services does not include the use of such

- 1 capability for the management control, or operation of a
- 2 telecommunications system or the management of a telecommunica-
- 3 tions service
- 4 (1) 'LATA' means the local access and transport area as
- 5 defined in United States v American Telephone and Telegraph Co
- 6 569 F Supp 990 (D D C 1983)
- 7 (j) License means a license issued pursuant to this act or
- 8 a certificate of convenience and necessity issued or other
- 9 authority granted, to a provider before January 1, 1992
- 10 (k) 'Line or access line" means the medium over which a
- 11 telecommunication user connects into the local exchange
- 12 (1) Local calling area means a geographic area encompass-
- 13 ing 1 or more local communities as described in maps tariffs or
- 14 rate schedules filed with and approved by the commission
- (m) Local directory assistance means the provision by
- 16 telephone of a listed telephone number within the caller's area
- 17 code
- (n) 'Local exchange rate means the monthly rate including
- 19 all necessary and attendant charges imposed for basic local
- 20 exchange service to customers
- 21 (O) OPERATOR SERVICES MEANS A TELECOMMUNICATION SERVICE
- 22 THAT INCLUDES ANY AUTOMATIC OR LIVE ASSISTANCE TO A CONSUMER TO
- 23 ARRANGE FOR BILLING OR COMPLETION OF A TELEPHONE CALL BETWEEN
- 24 POINTS WITHIN THIS STATE THAT ARE SPECIFIED BY THE USER THROUGH A
- 25 METHOD OTHER THAN 1 OF THE FOLLOWING
- 26 (1) AUTOMATIC COMPLETION WITH BILLING TO THE TELEPHONE FROM
- 27 WHICH THE CALL ORIGINATED

- 1 (11) COMPLETION THROUGH AN ACCESS CODE OR A PROPRIETARY
- 2 ACCOUNT NUMBER USED BY THE CONSUMER WITH BILLING TO AN ACCOUNT
- 3 PREVIOUSLY ESTABLISHED WITH THE CARRIER BY THE CONSUMER
- 4 (111) COMPLETION IN ASSOCIATION WITH DIRECTORY ASSISTANCE
- 5 SERVICES
- 6 (P) PAY TELEPHONE SERVICE MEANS A PUBLIC SEMIPUBLIC OR
- 7 CUSTOMER OWNED TELEPHONE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC AND IS ACCESSED
- 8 BY COIN, CASH, CREDIT CARD, OR ANY OTHER METHOD OF PAYMENT THAT
- 9 IS ARRANGED AT THE TIME THE CALL IS MADE
- 10 (Q) -(o) 'Person means an individual corporation, part-
- 11 nership, association, governmental entity, or any other legal
- 12 entity
- (R) $\frac{(p)}{(p)}$ Reasonable rate or just and reasonable rate
- 14 means a rate that is not inadequate, excessive or discriminatory
- 15 as determined by the commission
- (S) $\frac{(q)}{(q)}$ "Residential customer means a person to whom
- 17 telecommunication services are furnished predominantly for per-
- 18 sonal or domestic purposes at the person s dwelling
- 19 (T) $\frac{(r)}{(r)}$ "Special access' means the provision of access,
- 20 other than switched access to a local exchange network for the
- 21 purpose of enabling a provider to originate or terminate telecom-

- 3 sion of 2-way interactive communication and associated usage
- 4 (W) -(u) "Toll service" means the transmission of 2-way
- 5 interactive switched communication between local calling areas
- 6 Toll service does not include individually negotiated contracts
- 7 for similar telecommunication services or wide area telecommuni-
- 8 cations service
- 9 (X) (v) Wide area telecommunications service or 'WATS
- 10 means the transmission of 2-way interactive switched communica-
- 11 tion over a dedicated access line
- 12 Sec 207a Within 90 days of the effective date of this act
- 13 and after receiving public comment, the commission shall deter-
- 14 mine whether -coin-operated PAY telephones direct-inward dial-
- 15 ing, and touch-tone service are essential to the public health
- 16 safety or general welfare and should be regulated under this
- 17 act

- 17 (D) THE LOCATION OF ALL PAY TELEPHONES OF THE PROVIDER
- 18 (E) ANY OTHER INFORMATION THAT THE COMMISSION MAY REQUIRE
- 19 (2) THE REGISTRATION SHALL BE ACCOMPANIED WITH A REGISTRA-
- 20 TION FEE OF \$100 00
- 21 (3) THE REGISTRATION IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY UPON FILING
- 22 WITH THE COMMISSION AND THE PAYMENT OF THE REGISTRATION FEE AND
- 23 SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT FOR 1 YEAR FROM ITS EFFECTIVE DATE
- 24 (4) A REGISTRATION MAY BE RENEWED FOR 1 YEAR BY FILING WITH
- 25 THE COMMISSION A RENEWAL REGISTRATION ON A FORM PROVIDED BY THE
- 26 COMMISSION AND THE PAYMENT OF A RENEWAL FEE OF \$100 00

- 1 (5) THE COMMISSION SHALL CREATE A 1-800 TOLL-FREE NUMBER
- 2 THAT CAN BE DIALED TO REPORT TO THE COMMISSION A PAY TELEPHONE
- 3 THAT IS INOPERATIVE THE 1-800 NUMBER SHALL BE CONSPICUOUSLY
- 4 POSTED ON OR NEAR EACH PAY TELEPHONE OF THE PROVIDER
- 5 (6) IF THE COMMISSION RECEIVES A REPORT PURSUANT TO
- 6 SUBSECTION (5), IT SHALL IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY THE REGISTERED PRO-
- 7 VIDER OF THE INOPERATIVE PAY TELEPHONE
- 8 (7) THE PROVIDER OF A PRIVATELY OWNED PAY TELEPHONE SHALL
- 9 POST IN A CONSPICUOUS LOCATION ON OR NEAR THE PAY TELEPHONE THE
- 10 RATES AND CHARGES ASSOCIATED WITH THE USE OF THE PAY TELEPHONE
- 11 (8) IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER PENALTY PROVIDED FOR IN THIS
- 12 ACT A PERSON WHO SUFFERS DAMAGES DUE TO A VIOLATION OF THIS SEC-
- 13 TION MAY BRING AN ACTION IN A COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION TO
- 14 RECOVER ACTUAL DAMAGES OR \$250 00, WHICHEVER IS GREATER, ALONG
- 15 WITH REASONABLE ATTORNEY FEES
