

## HOUSE BILL No. 5567

May 19 1994 Introduced by Reps Curtis Willard Clack Harder Freeman Scott Dobronski Owen Wetters and Emerson and referred to the Committee on Local Government

A bill to amend the title and sections 1 2 4 7, 10, 11 and 12 of Act No 261 of the Public Acts of 1966 entitled as amended

An act to provide for the apportionment of county boards of commissioners to prescribe the size of the board to provide for appeals to prescribe the manner of election of the members of the county board of commissioners to provide for compensation of members and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts

sections 11 and 12 as amended by Act No 504 of the Public Acts of 1982 being sections 46 401, 46 402, 46 404, 46 407 46 410, 46 411 and 46 412 of the Michigan Compiled Laws

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT

- 1 Section 1 The title and sections 1, 2, 4, 7, 10, 11, and 2 12 of Act No 261 of the Public Acts of 1966, sections 11 and 12
- 3 as amended by Act No 504 of the Public Acts of 1982, being

- 3 TITLE
- 4 An act to provide for the apportionment of county boards of
- 5 commissioners AND BOARDS OF COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONERS to pre-
- 6 scribe the size of the board COUNTY BOARDS OF COMMISSIONERS to
- 7 provide for appeals to prescribe the manner of election of the
- 8 members of the county board BOARDS of commissioners to pro-
- 9 vide for compensation of members OF COUNTY BOARDS OF
- 10 COMMISSIONERS and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts
- 11 Sec 1 (1) Within NOT MORE THAN 60 days after the publi-
- 12 cation of the latest United States official decennial census fig-
- 13 ures the county apportionment commission in each county of this
- 14 state shall apportion the county into not less than 5 -nor OR
- 15 more than 35 county commissioner districts as nearly of equal
- 16 population as is practicable and within the limitations of sec-
- 17 tion 2 In counties under 75,000, upon the effective date of
- 18 this act, the boards of commissioners of such counties shall have
- 19 not to exceed 30 days into which to apportion their county into
- 20 commissioner districts in accordance with the provisions of this
- 21 act If at the expiration of the time as set forth in this sec-
- 22 tion a board of commissioners has not so apportioned itself, the
- 23 county apportionment commission shall proceed to apportion the
- 24 county under the provisions of this act
- 25 (2) IF A COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONER OF A COUNTY WILL BE
- 26 ELECTED FROM A DISTRICT AT THE NEXT GENERAL NOVEMBER ELECTION
- 27 PURSUANT TO SECTION 6A OF CHAPTER IV OF ACT NO 283 OF THE PUBLIC

- 1 ACTS OF 1909, BEING SECTION 224 6A OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS,
- 2 AND IF THE COUNTY APPORTIONMENT COMMISSION HAS NOT ALREADY APPOR-
- 3 TIONED THE COUNTY INTO COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONER DISTRICTS SINCE
- 4 THE PUBLICATION OF THE LATEST UNITED STATES DECENNIAL CENSUS FIG-
- 5 URES, THE COUNTY APPORTIONMENT COMMISSION SHALL APPORTION THE
- 6 COUNTY INTO 3 COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONER DISTRICTS AS NEARLY OF
- 7 EQUAL POPULATION AS IS PRACTICABLE BY NOT LATER THAN JANUARY 1 OF
- 8 THE YEAR OF THE NEXT GENERAL NOVEMBER ELECTION
- 9 Sec 2 THE NUMBER OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IN A COUNTY
- 10 SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS

- 17 Sec 4 In apportioning the county into COUNTY commissioner
- 18 AND COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONER districts, the county apportionment
- 19 commission shall be governed by the following guidelines in the
- 20 stated order of importance
- (a) All districts shall be single-member districts and as
- 22 nearly of equal population as is practicable The latest offi-
- 23 cial published figures of the United States official census shall
- 24 be used in this determination, except that in cases requiring
- 25 division of official census units to meet the population stan-
- 26 dard, an actual population count may be used to make -such- THE
- 27 division Other governmental census figures of total population

- 1 -may be used if taken subsequent to the last decennial United
- 2 States census -and- MAY BE USED IF the United States census fig-
- 3 ures are not adequate for the purposes of this act The secre-
- 4 tary of state shall furnish the latest official published figures
- 5 to the county apportionment commissions -forthwith upon this act
- 6 taking effect and within NOT MORE THAN 15 days after publica-
- 7 tion of -subsequent THE United States official census figures
- 8 A contract may be entered into with the United States census
- 9 bureau to make any special census if the latest United States
- 10 decennial census figures are not adequate
- (b) All districts shall be contiguous
- (c) All districts shall be as compact and of as nearly
- 13 square shape as is practicable, depending on the geography of the
- 14 county area involved
- 15 (d) No A township or part thereof OF A TOWNSHIP shall
- 16 NOT be combined with any A city or part thereof OF A CITY for
- 17 a single district unless -such THE combination is needed to
- 18 meet the population standard
- (e) Townships, villages, and cities shall be divided only if
- 20 necessary to meet the population standard
- 21 (f) Precincts shall be divided only if necessary to meet the
- 22 population standard
- 23 (q) Residents of state institutions who cannot by law regis-
- 24 ter in the county as electors shall be excluded from any consid-
- 25 eration of representation
- 26 (h) Districts shall not be drawn to effect partisan
- 27 political advantage

- 1 Sec 7 (1) If the apportionment commission has failed
- 2 FAILS to submit a plan for its county within TO APPORTION THE
- 3 COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS NOT MORE THAN 60 days but AND not
- 4 less than 30 days after the latest official published census fig-
- 5 ures are available or within -such additional time as may be
- 6 granted by the court of appeals for good cause shown on petition
- 7 from the apportionment commission -any A registered voter of
- 8 the county may submit a plan to the commission for approval
- 9 (2) IF THE APPORTIONMENT COMMISSION FAILS TO SUBMIT A PLAN
- 10 TO APPORTION THE BOARD OF COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONERS WITHIN THE
- 11 TIME REQUIRED BY SECTION 1(2) OR WITHIN SUCH ADDITIONAL TIME AS
- 12 MAY BE GRANTED BY THE COURT OF APPEALS FOR GOOD CAUSE SHOWN ON
- 13 PETITION FROM THE APPORTIONMENT COMMISSION, A REGISTERED VOTER OF

- 22 Sec 10 The term of each COUNTY commissioner shall be con-

- 26 Sec 11 Candidates for the office of COUNTY commissioner
- 27 shall be residents and registered voters of the district -which-

- 1 THAT they seek to represent and shall remain so to hold their
- 2 office, if elected Nominations and elections for COUNTY commis-
- 3 sioners shall be by partisan elections To obtain the printing
- 4 of the name of -any A person as a candidate for nomination for
- 5 the office of commissioner upon the official primary ballot,
- 6 there shall be filed with the county clerk of each county a
- 7 filing fee of \$100 00 or nomination petitions signed by a number
- 8 of qualified and registered electors residing within the district
- 9 --- equal to not less than 1% -nor- OR more than 4% of the number
- 10 of votes cast in the district by -such THE party for the office
- 11 of secretary of state at the last general election in which a
- 12 secretary of state was elected The deadline for filing nomina-
- 13 tion petitions or filing fees -shall be IS the same as FOR can-

- 16 Public Acts of 1941 being section 38 412a of the Michigan
- 17 Compiled Laws -shall IS not -be- eligible for election to the
- 18 office of county commissioner for a period of 20 years after
- 19 conviction
- 20 Sec 12 (1) When IF a vacancy occurs in the office of
- 21 COUNTY commissioner by death, resignation removal from the dis-
- 22 trict, or removal from office, the vacancy shall be filled by
- 23 appointment within 30 days by the county board of commissioners
- 24 of a resident and registered voter of that district A person
- 25 who has been convicted of a violation of section 12a(1) of Act
- 26 No 370 of the Public Acts of 1941, being section 38 412a of the
- 27 Michigan Compiled Laws, shall IS not be eligible for

- 1 appointment to the office of county commissioner for a period of
- 2 20 years after conviction
- 3 (2) The A person appointed to fill a vacancy which
- 4 occurred IN THE OFFICE OF COUNTY COMMISSIONER THAT OCCURS in an
- 5 odd numbered year shall serve until the vacancy is filled in a
- 6 special election That THE special election shall be called by
- 7 the county board of commissioners The A person appointed to
- 8 fill a vacancy -which THAT occurs in a year -which THAT is an
- 9 election year for the office of county commissioner shall serve
- 10 for the remainder of the unexpired term 
  If the county board of
- 11 commissioners does not fill the vacancy by appointment within 30
- 12 days, that THE vacancy shall be filled by a special election
- 13 regardless of whether the year is an election year or an odd
- 14 NUMBERED year
- 15 Section 2 This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
- 16 all of the following bills of the 87th Legislature are enacted
- 17 into law
