A bill to amend section 102 of Act No 32 of the Public Acts of 1986, entitled as amended

Emergency telephone service enabling act,' as amended by Act No 196 of the Public Acts of 1991, being section 484 1102 of the Michigan Compiled Laws

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT

1 Section 1 Section 102 of Act No 32 of the Public Acts of
2 1986 as amended by Act No 196 of the Public Acts of 1991 being
3 section 484 1102 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to
4 read as follows

5 Sec 102 As used in this act

6 (a) "Automatic location identification" or "ALI" means a
7 9-1-1 service feature in which the service supplier automatically
8 forwards the name or address, or both associated with the

1 calling party s telephone number as identified by automatic
2 number identification, to the public safety answering point

3 (b) "Automatic number identification" or "ANI" means a 9-1-1
4 service feature in which the service supplier automatically for-
5 wards the calling party s billing telephone number to the public,
6 safety answering point for display

7 (c) Direct dispatch method means the method of responding
8 to a telephone request for emergency service whereby the person
9 receiving the call at the public safety answering point decides
10 on the proper action to be taken and dispatches the appropriate
11 available emergency service unit located closest to the request
12 for emergency service

13 (d) "Emergency telephone charge" means emergency telephone
14 operational charge and emergency telephone technical charge

15 (e) Emergency telephone operational charge means a charge
16 for nonnetwork technical equipment and other costs directly
17 related to the operation of a PSAP including, but not limited to
18 dispatch personnel, costs associated with non-PSAP operation such
19 as response vehicles and personnel shall not be included in those
20 assessments levied under this act

21 (f) "Emergency telephone technical charge" means a charge
22 for the network start-up costs, customer notification costs,
23 billing costs including an allowance for uncollectibles, and net-
24 work nonrecurring and recurring installation, maintenance, serv-
25 ice and equipment network charges of a service supplier provid-
26 ing 9-1-1 service pursuant to this act

(g) 'Exchange access facility means the access from a particular service user's premises to the telephone system Exchange access facilities include service supplier provided access lines, PBX trunks, and centrex line trunk equivalents all as defined by tariffs of the service suppliers as approved by the public service commission Exchange access facilities do not include ~~service supplier owned and operated~~ telephone pay station lines ~~—~~ or WATS, FX, or incoming only lines

(h) 'Final 9-1-1 service plan means a tentative 9-1-1 service plan that has been modified only to reflect necessary changes resulting from any exclusions of public agencies from the 9-1-1 service district of the tentative 9-1-1 service plan pursuant to section 306 and any failure of public safety agencies to be designated as PSAPs or secondary PSAPs pursuant to section 307

(i) "Person" means any individual firm partnership joint venture association cooperative organization corporation, whether or not organized for profit municipal corporation state or other governmental entity agency body department commission board bureau fraternal organization nonprofit organization estate trust business or common law trust receiver assignee for the benefit of creditors trustee or trustee in bankruptcy

(j) "Prime rate" means the average predominant prime rate quoted by not less than 3 commercial financial institutions as determined by the department of treasury

(k) "Private safety entity" means a private entity which provides emergency fire, ambulance, or medical services

1 (l) "Public agency" means any village, township, charter
2 township, or city within the state, and any special purpose dis-
3 trict located in whole or in part within the state, which pro-
4 vides or has authority to provide fire fighting, law enforcement
5 ambulance medical or other emergency services

6 (m) Public safety agency means a functional division of a
7 public agency county or the state of Michigan which provides
8 fire fighting law enforcement, ambulance medical or other
9 emergency services

10 (n) "Public safety answering point" or PSAP means a commu-
11 nications facility operated or answered on a 24-hour basis
12 assigned responsibility by a public agency or county to receive
13 9-1-1 calls and as appropriate, to directly dispatch emergency
14 response services or to transfer or relay emergency 9-1-1 calls
15 to other public safety agencies It is the first point of recep-
16 tion by a public safety agency of a 9-1-1 call, and serves the
17 jurisdictions in which it is located and other participating
18 jurisdictions, if any

19 (o) 'Relay method means the method of responding to a tele-
20 phone request for emergency service whereby a PSAP notes perti-
21 nent information and relays it by telephone, radio, or private
22 line to the appropriate public safety agency or other provider of
23 emergency services that has an available emergency service unit
24 located closest to the request for emergency service for dispatch
25 of an emergency service unit

26 (p) 'Secondary public safety answering point or secondary
27 PSAP means a communications facility of a public safety agency

1 or private safety entity which receives 9-1-1 calls by the
2 transfer method only and generally serves as a centralized loca-
3 tion for a particular type of emergency call

4 (q) "Service supplier" means any person providing telephone
5 services to a service user in this state

6 (r) Service user" means any exchange access facility cus-
7 tomer of a service supplier within a 9-1-1 system

8 (s) Tariff rate means the rate approved by the public
9 service commission for 9-1-1 service provided by a particular
10 service supplier

11 (t) Tentative 9-1-1 service plan means a plan for imple-
12 menting a 9-1-1 system in a specified 9-1-1 service district
13 after consultation with the director of the department of state
14 police or his or her designated representative, which complies
15 with chapter II, and which addresses the following system
16 considerations

17 (i) Technical considerations of the service supplier includ-
18 ing system equipment for facilities that would be used in provid-
19 ing emergency telephone service

20 (ii) Operational considerations including the designation of
21 PSAPs and secondary PSAPs and the manner in which 9-1-1 calls
22 would be processed, dispatch functions performed, and information
23 systems utilized

24 (iii) Managerial considerations including the organizational
25 form and agreements which would control technical, operational,
26 and fiscal aspects of the emergency telephone service

1 (1v) Fiscal considerations including projected nonrecurring
2 and recurring costs with a financial plan for implementing and
3 operating the system

4 (v) The tentative 9-1-1 service plan shall require each
5 public agency and county operating a PSAP under the 9-1-1 system
6 to pay directly for all installation and recurring charges for
7 terminal equipment including customer premises equipment asso-
8 ciated with the public agency s or the county s PSAP and may
9 require each public agency and county operating a PSAP under the
10 9-1-1 system to pay directly to the service supplier all instal-
11 lation and recurring charges for all 9-1-1 exchange and tie lines
12 associated with the public agency s or the county s PSAP

13 (u) Transfer method means the method of responding to a
14 telephone request for emergency service whereby a PSAP transfers
15 the call directly to the appropriate public safety agency or
16 other provider of emergency service that has an available emer-
17 gency service unit located closest to the request for emergency
18 service for dispatch of an emergency service unit

19 (v) Universal emergency number service or 9-1-1 service
20 means public telephone service which provides service users with
21 the ability to reach a public safety answering point by dialing
22 the digits "9-1-1"

23 (w) 'Universal emergency number service district' or '9-1-1
24 service district' means the area in which 9-1-1 service is pro-
25 vided or is planned to be provided to service users under a 9-1-1
26 system implemented pursuant to this act

1 (x) Universal emergency number service system or 9-1-1
2 system" means a system for providing 9-1-1 service pursuant to
3 this act
