

SENATE BILL No. 115

January 13, 1993, Introduced by Senator DI NELLO and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend sections 559, 561, 568, 570, 572, 575, 576, and 795 of Act No. 116 of the Public Acts of 1954, entitled "Michigan election law,"

sections 568, 570, and 576 as amended by Act No. 160 of the Public Acts of 1985 and section 795 as amended by Act No. 8 of the Public Acts of 1992, being sections 168.559, 168.561, 168.568, 168.570, 168.572, 168.575, 168.576, and 168.795 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Sections 559, 561, 568, 570, 572, 575, 576, and
- 2 795 of Act No. 116 of the Public Acts of 1954, sections 568, 570,
- 3 and 576 as amended by Act No. 160 of the Public Acts of 1985 and
- 4 section 795 as amended by Act No. 8 of the Public Acts of 1992,
- **5** being sections 168.559, 168.561, 168.568, 168.570, 168.572,

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- 1 168.575, 168.576, and 168.795 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, are
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 559. It shall be the duty of the THE board of elec-
- 4 tion commissioners of each county in this state -to- SHALL pre-
- 5 pare and furnish the necessary official primary election ballots,
- 6 except for city offices, -which THAT may be required for use by
- 7 the electors -of any political party at the August primary.
- 8 Sec. 561. (1) The ballots prepared by the board of election
- 9 commissioners in each county for use by the electors -of a polit-
- 10 ical party at a primary election shall include the names of all
- 11 candidates of -the- EACH political party for the office of gover-
- 12 nor, United States senator, and district offices; -, and, in
- 13 each county, the names of all candidates of -the- EACH political
- 14 party for county offices; -- and in each township, the names of
- 15 all candidates of -the- EACH political party for township
- 16 offices.
- 17 (2) If, in a district comprised of not more than 1 county, 2
- 18 or more candidates, including candidates for nonpartisan offices,
- 19 for the same office have the same or similar surnames, a candi-
- 20 date may file a written request with the board of county election
- 21 commissioners for a clarifying designation. The CANDIDATE
- 22 REQUESTING THE CLARIFYING DESIGNATION SHALL FILE THE request
- 23 -shall be filed not later than 3 days after the last date for
- 24 filing nominating petitions. Not later than 3 days after the
- 25 filing of the request, the board of county election commissioners
- 26 shall determine whether a similarity exists and whether a
- 27 clarifying designation should be granted. In a district

- 1 comprised of more than 1 county, the board of state canvassers
- 2 shall make a like determination for a clarifying designation upon
- 3 the written request of a candidate who files nominating petitions
- 4 with the secretary of state. The CANDIDATE REQUESTING THE CLARI-
- 5 FYING DESIGNATION SHALL FILE THE request -shall-be filed with
- 6 the state board of canvassers not later than 5 days after the
- 7 last date for filing nominating petitions. The board of state
- 8 canvassers shall make its determination at the same time it makes
- 9 a declaration of the sufficiency or insufficiency of nominating
- 10 petitions in compliance with section 552.
- 11 (3) In each instance UPON MAKING A DETERMINATION UNDER
- 12 SUBSECTION (2), the determining board shall notify the requester
- 13 and the other candidate affected of its determination by first
- 14 class mail sent within 24 hours after the final date for the
- 15 determination. A candidate who is dissatisfied with the determi-
- 16 nation of the board of county election commissioners may file an
- 17 appeal in the circuit court of the county where the board is
- 18 located. and a A candidate who is dissatisfied with the
- 19 determination of the board of state canvassers may file an appeal
- 20 in the circuit court of Ingham county. -- THE CANDIDATE SHALL
- 21 FILE AN APPEAL UNDER THIS SUBSECTION within 7 days after the
- 22 final date for determination by the board, and the court shall
- 23 hear the matter de novo. In case of the same surnames, or a
- 24 final determination by the board OF THE EXISTENCE OF SIMILARITY,
- 25 or A DETERMINATION by the court before the latest date on which
- 26 the board can arrange for printing of the ballots -, of the
- 27 existence of similarity, the board shall print the occupation or

- 1 residence of each of the candidates on the ballot or ballot
- 2 labels under their respective names. The term "occupation"
- 3 shall be construed to include INCLUDES political office, even
- 4 though it is not the candidate's principal occupation, but
- 5 shall DOES not include reference to a previous position or
- 6 occupation.
- 7 (4) The name of a candidate shall be printed showing the
- 8 given name or abbreviation or initials of the given name of the
- 9 candidate. , and, in the case of a married woman, IF THE CANDI-
- 10 DATE IS MARRIED, THE NAME OF THE CANDIDATE shall not be printed
- 11 showing the -husband's SPOUSE'S given name.
- 12 (5) The board of state canvassers shall prepare and issue
- 13 guidelines to -insure- ENSURE fairness and uniformity in the
- 14 granting of CLARIFYING designations, and may prepare and issue
- 15 guidelines relating to what constitutes same or similar
- 16 surnames. The board of state canvassers and the boards of county
- 17 election commissioners shall follow the quidelines issued.
- 18 Sec. 568. The official primary election ballots shall be
- 19 prepared in the -following form -- PRESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION.
- 20 At the top of each ballot shall be printed in large type,
- 21 "Official primary election ballot". Underneath the heading shall
- 22 be printed the date of the election at which the ballot is to be
- 23 used, together with a designation of the political subdivision,
- 24 -as INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO county, district, city, OR
- 25 ward, -et cetera, in which it is to be used. Then shall follow,
- 26 in bold-faced type, the name of the political party and vignette,
- 27 below which shall appear the following instructions to electors:

1 "Make a cross or a check mark in the square to the left of not 2 more than the number of names for each office as may be indicated 3 under the title of each office. YOU MAY SPLIT YOUR TICKET BY 4 VOTING FOR NOT MORE THAN THE NUMBER OF NAMES INDICATED FOR AN 5 OFFICE UNDER 1 POLITICAL PARTY HEADING AND FOR NOT MORE THAN THE 6 NUMBER OF NAMES INDICATED FOR A DIFFERENT OFFICE UNDER ANOTHER 7 POLITICAL PARTY'S HEADING." Under this heading shall appear the 8 names of the candidates seeking nomination for various offices on 9 the ticket of the political party. The order of the offices on 10 the ballot shall be the same, as near as may be, as is required 11 by law in making up the ballot used at general elections. 12 title of the office shall be immediately above the names of the 13 candidate or candidates for the nomination of each office, and 14 under the title the words "Vote for not more than," followed by 15 the word "one" or "two" or -such other word -as will designate 16 THAT DESIGNATES the number of candidates for the nomination to 17 the office that may be voted for. The names of the different 18 candidates shall be separated from each other by a light-faced 19 rule with a square at the left of each name. The spaces devoted 20 to the candidates for nomination to different offices shall be 21 separated by a black-faced rule so as IN ORDER to separate each 22 office division distinctly. However, the board of election com-23 missioners in any county or city may, if considered desirable, 24 arrange the ballots with an identification numeral to be placed 25 in the same space with the name of each of the candidates, with

26 the identification numeral to be rotated with the name of the

1	candidate when rotated, regardless of where the name may appear		
2	upon the ballot.		
3	Sec. 570. Paper ballots shall be numbered consecutively and		
4	identified by use of the words "official primary ballot" on the		
5	upper right hand corner upon the front of the ballot with a per-		
6	forated line across the corner and underneath the number and		
7	identification so that the corner with the number and identifica-		
8	tion may be torn off. The detachable corner stub shall serve for		
9	the several party tickets and the ballot number shall be printed		
10	upon the stub on 1 side only. A political party designation		
11	shall not appear upon a ballot corner so numbered and		
12	identified. After the ballots are trimmed and wrapped in sealed		
13	3 packages, they shall be distributed for use at the primary elec-		
14	tion in the same manner as is now provided by law for the distri-		
15	5 bution of ballots to be used at general elections. Ballots shall		
16	be prepared in substantially the following form:

41 Sec. 572. The OFFICIAL PRIMARY ELECTION ballots shall be

42 prepared in -such A manner that the electors -of each political

- 1 party AT THE PRIMARY may write, print, or paste the name of a
- 2 candidate -thereon- ON A BALLOT.
- 3 Sec. 575. After the polls are opened at a primary election,
- 4 any AN elector who is legally registered and qualified,
- 5 shall, before entering the booth or voting compartment, SHALL
- 6 be furnished -a party ballot, together with any other ballot or
- 7 ALL ballots to be voted at that primary election.
- 8 Sec. 576. Each elector, after having received -a ballot or
- 9 THE OFFICIAL PRIMARY ELECTION ballots, shall enter a booth or
- 10 voting compartment and, while there concealed from view, shall
- 11 vote the ballot or ballots by making a cross or a check mark in
- 12 the square at the left of the names of those candidates for whom
- 13 the elector desires to vote, but -in-no case- NOT for more candi-
- 14 dates for any office than is indicated under the title of each
- 15 office. An HOWEVER, AN elector may -, however, vote for any
- 16 person whose name is not printed on the ballot by inserting the
- 17 name in a manner that will substitute it for any name -which-
- 18 THAT is printed on the ballot or where no candidate's name
- 19 appears upon the ballot. The elector shall indicate his or her
- 20 choice of candidates on 1 party ticket only and, after AFTER
- 21 marking the ballot OR BALLOTS, the elector shall fold -it EACH
- 22 BALLOT for deposit -in accordance with the provisions of AS PRO-
- 23 VIDED IN this act. Any ballot on which more than 1 party ticket
- 24 has been voted is void.-
- 25 Sec. 795. (1) An electronic voting system acquired or used
- 26 pursuant to sections 794 to 799a shall meet all of the following
- 27 requirements:

- 1 (a) Provide for voting in secrecy, except in the case of 2 FOR voters who receive assistance as provided by this act.
- 3 (b) Permit each elector to vote at an election for all per-
- 4 sons and offices for whom and for which the elector is lawfully
- 5 entitled to vote; to vote for as many persons for an office as
- 6 the elector is entitled to vote for; and to vote for or against
- 7 any question upon which the elector is entitled to vote. Except
- 8 as otherwise provided in this subdivision, the electronic tabu-
- 9 lating equipment shall reject all choices recorded on the
- 10 elector's ballot for an office or a question if the number of
- 11 choices exceeds the number that the elector is entitled to vote
- 12 for on that office or question. Electronic tabulating equipment
- 13 that can detect and inform an elector voting in person that the
- 14 choices recorded on the elector's ballot for an office or a ques-
- 15 tion exceeds the number that the elector is entitled to vote for
- 16 on that office or question shall offer the elector an opportunity
- 17 to correct the error before rejecting the choices recorded on the
- 18 elector's ballot.
- (c) Permit an elector, at a presidential election, by a
- 20 single selection to vote for the candidates of a party for presi-
- 21 dent, vice-president, and presidential electors.
- (d) Permit an elector at other than a primary election to
- 23 vote for all of the candidates of a political party by a single
- 24 selection -or- AND PERMIT AN ELECTOR AT ANY ELECTION to vote a
- 25 split or mixed ticket.
- (e) Permit an elector in a primary election to vote for the
- 27 candidates in the party primary of the elector's choice.

- 1 Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, the electronic
- 2 tabulating equipment shall reject each ballot on which votes are
- 3 cast for candidates of more than 1 political party. Electronic
- 4 tabulating equipment that can detect and inform an elector voting
- 5 in person that the elector has voted for candidates of more than
- 6 1 political party shall offer the elector an opportunity to cor-
- 7 rect the error before rejecting the elector's ballot.
- 8 (f) Prevent an elector from voting for the same person more
- 9 than once for the same office.
- 10 (g) Be suitably designed for the purpose used; be durably
- 11 constructed; and be designed to provide for safety, accuracy, and
- 12 efficiency.
- 13 (h) Beginning June 18, 1990, be BE designed to accommodate
- 14 the needs of an elderly or handicapped voter.
- 15 (i) Record correctly and count accurately each vote properly
- 16 cast.
- 17 (j) Provide an audit trail.
- (k) Provide an acceptable method for an elector to vote for
- 19 a person whose name does not appear on the ballot.
- (2) Electronic tabulating equipment that counts votes at the
- 21 precinct before the close of the polls shall provide a method for
- 22 rendering the equipment inoperable if vote totals are revealed
- 23 before the close of the polls.
