



SENATE BILL No. 376

February 10, 1993, Introduced by Senators KELLY, CHERRY and MILLER and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend section 2507 of Act No. 236 of the Public Acts of 1961, entitled as amended
"Revised judicature act of 1961,"
being section 600.2507 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Section 2507 of Act No. 236 of the Public Acts
2 of 1961, being section 600.2507 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is
3 amended to read as follows:

4 Sec. 2507. (1) The secretary of state, THE auditor general,
5 THE STATE treasurer, and THE attorney general ~~—, respectively,~~
6 ~~shall be authorized to~~ MAY require searches in the respective

7 (2) THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LICENSING AND REGULA-
8 TION MAY REQUEST SEARCHES AND OBTAIN CERTIFIED COPIES AND CERTI-
9 FIED EXTRACTS OF PAPERS, RECORDS, OR DOCUMENTS PERTAINING TO
10 CRIMINAL MATTERS, MEDICAL MALPRACTICE, OR OTHER PUBLIC DOCUMENTS
11 OR RECORDS NECESSARY TO THE DISCHARGE OF THE DUTIES OF THE
12 DEPARTMENT OF LICENSING AND REGULATION FROM THE SECRETARY OF
13 STATE, THE AUDITOR GENERAL, THE STATE TREASURER, THE CLERKS OF
14 THE SUPREME COURT, THE PROBATE COURT, AND ANY OTHER COURT OF
15 RECORD, OR FROM THE OFFICE OF A REGISTER OF DEEDS, WITHOUT THE
16 PAYMENT OF A FEE OR CHARGE.

17 Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
