

## **SENATE BILL No. 400**

February 16, 1993, Introduced by Senators POLLACK, DINGELL, DILLINGHAM, KOIVISTO, HART, CONROY, FAUST, STABENOW and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend section 3 of Act No. 213 of the Public Acts of 1965, entitled as amended

"An act to provide for setting aside the conviction in certain criminal cases; to provide for the effect of such action; to provide for the retention of certain nonpublic records and their use; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain public agencies and officers; and to prescribe penalties,"

as amended by Act No. 11 of the Public Acts of 1988, being section 780.623 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Section 3 of Act No. 213 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1965, as amended by Act No. 11 of the Public Acts of 1988, being
- 3 section 780.623 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read
- 4 as follows:
- 5 Sec. 3. (1) Upon the entry of ENTERING an order pursuant
- 6 to section 1(9), the court shall send a copy of the order to the
- 7 arresting agency and the department of state police.

- 1 (2) The department of state police shall retain a nonpublic
- 2 record of the order setting aside a conviction and of the record
- 3 of the arrest, fingerprints, conviction, and sentence of the
- 4 applicant in the case to which the order applies. Except as pro-
- 5 vided in subsection (3), this nonpublic record shall be made
- 6 available only to a court of competent jurisdiction, an agency of
- 7 the judicial branch of state government, a law enforcement
- 8 agency, a prosecuting attorney, the attorney general, or the gov-
- 9 ernor upon request and only for the following purposes:
- (a) For consideration in a licensing function conducted by
- 11 an agency of the judicial branch of state government.
- (b) To show that a person who has filed an application
- 13 to set aside a conviction has previously had a conviction set
- 14 aside pursuant to this act.
- (c) For the court's consideration in determining the sen-
- 16 tence to be imposed upon conviction for a subsequent offense
- 17 which THAT is punishable as a felony or by imprisonment for
- 18 more than 1 year.
- (d) For consideration by the governor if a person whose
- 20 conviction has been set aside applies for a pardon for another
- 21 offense.
- (e) For consideration by a law enforcement agency if a
- 23 person whose conviction has been set aside applies for employment
- 24 with the law enforcement agency.
- 25 (F) FOR CONSIDERATION BY A COURT, LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY,
- 26 PROSECUTING ATTORNEY, OR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IN DETERMINING
- 27 WHETHER AN INDIVIDUAL REQUIRED TO REGISTER UNDER THE SEX

- 1 OFFENDERS REGISTRATION ACT HAS VIOLATED THAT ACT, OR FOR USE IN A
- 2 PROSECUTION FOR VIOLATING THAT ACT.
- 3 (3) A copy of the nonpublic record created under subsection
- 4 (2) shall be provided to the person whose conviction is set aside
- 5 under this act upon payment of a fee determined and charged
- 6 by the department of state police in the same manner as the fee
- 7 prescribed in section 4 of the freedom of information act, Act
- 8 No. 442 of the Public Acts of 1976, being section 15.234 of the
- 9 Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 10 (4) The nonpublic record maintained under subsection (2)
- 11 -shall be IS exempt from disclosure under the freedom of infor-
- 12 mation act, Act No. 442 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sec-
- 13 tions 15.231 to 15.246 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 14 (5) -A EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (2), A person -,
- 15 other than the applicant who knows or should have known that
- 16 a conviction was set aside under this section -- AND who
- 17 divulges, uses, or publishes information concerning a conviction
- 18 set aside under this section -, except as provided in subsection
- 19 (2), is guilty of a misdemeanor PUNISHABLE BY IMPRISONMENT FOR
- 20 NOT MORE THAN 90 DAYS OR A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$100.00, OR
- 21 BOTH.
- 22 Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless

- of the 87th Legislature is enacted into law.
