

## **SENATE BILL No. 488**

March 10, 1993, Introduced by Senators ARTHURHULTZ, MC MANUS, STABENOW, FAUST, POLLACK and O'BRIEN and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend the title and section 7 of Act No. 388 of the Public Acts of 1976, entitled "Michigan campaign finance act," being section 169.207 of the Michigan Compiled Laws; and to add section 50.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. The title and section 7 of Act No. 388 of the
- 2 Public Acts of 1976, being section 169.207 of the Michigan
- 3 Compiled Laws, are amended and section 50 is added to read as
- 4 follows:
  - TITLE
- An act to regulate political activity; to regulate campaign
- 7 financing; to restrict campaign contributions and expenditures;
- 8 to require campaign statements and reports; to regulate anonymous

- 1 contributions; to regulate campaign advertising and literature;
- 2 to provide for segregated funds for political purposes; to pro-
- 3 vide for the use of public funds for political purposes; to
- 4 create -a state campaign fund CERTAIN FUNDS; to provide for
- 5 reversion, -of RETENTION, or refunding of unexpended bal-
- 6 ances IN CERTAIN FUNDS; to require OTHER STATEMENTS AND reports;
- 7 TO REGULATE ACCEPTANCE OF CERTAIN GIFTS, PAYMENTS, AND REIMBURSE-
- 8 MENTS; TO PRESCRIBE THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF CERTAIN STATE
- 9 DEPARTMENTS AND STATE AND LOCAL OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES; to pro-
- 10 vide appropriations; to prescribe penalties AND PROVIDE REMEDIES;
- 11 and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts.
- Sec. 7. (1) "Filed" means the receipt by the appropriate
- 13 filing official of a statement or report required to be filed
- 14 under this act.
- 15 (2) "Filer" means a person required to file a statement or
- 16 report pursuant to this act.
- 17 (3) "Filing official" means the official designated pursuant
- 18 to this act to receive required statements and reports.
- 19 (4) "Fund raising event" means an event such as a dinner,
- 20 reception, testimonial, rally, auction, bingo, or similar affair
- 21 through which contributions are solicited or received by purchase
- 22 of a ticket, payment of an attendance fee, -donations or MAKING
- 23 A DONATION, PURCHASE OF chances for prizes, or through purchase
- 24 of goods or services.
- 25 (5) "Gift" means a payment, subscription, advance, forbear-
- 26 ance, rendering, or deposit of money, services, or anything of

- 1 value, unless consideration of equal or greater value is given
- 2 therefor.
- 3 (6) "HONORARIUM" MEANS A PAYMENT OF MONEY OR ANYTHING OF
- 4 VALUE TO A PERSON AS CONSIDERATION FOR AN APPEARANCE, A SPEECH,
- 5 AN ARTICLE, OR ANY ACTIVITY RELATED TO OR ASSOCIATED WITH THE
- 6 PERFORMANCE OF DUTIES BY THE PERSON. AN HONORARIUM DOES NOT
- 7 INCLUDE ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 8 (A) REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE COST OF TRANSPORTATION OR ACCOMMO-
- 9 DATIONS FOR THE PERSON AND HIS OR HER IMMEDIATE FAMILY.
- 10 (B) A PAYMENT DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION BY THE FEDERAL
- 11 GOVERNMENT, STATE GOVERNMENT, OR A GOVERNMENTAL UNIT OUTSIDE OF
- 12 THIS STATE.
- 13 (C) A PAYMENT DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION BY AN ASSOCIATION
- 14 OF GOVERNMENTAL OFFICIALS OF THE SAME TYPE AS THE PERSON WHO
- 15 RECEIVES THE HONORARIUM OR A NATIONAL OR REGIONAL ASSOCIATION OF
- 16 GOVERNMENTAL OFFICIALS APPOINTED TO THE ASSOCIATION BY THEIR
- 17 STATE.
- 18 (D) A PAYMENT DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION RELATED TO OR
- 19 ASSOCIATED WITH A TOPIC ON WHICH THE PERSON HAS EXPERTISE GAINED
- 20 THROUGH TRAINING. EDUCATION, OR EXPERIENCE OUTSIDE OF THE PER-
- 21 FORMANCE OF OFFICIAL GOVERNMENTAL DUTIES BY THAT PERSON.
- 22 SEC. 50. A PERSON HOLDING STATE ELECTIVE OFFICE SHALL NOT
- 23 ACCEPT AN HONORARIUM. A PERSON WHO KNOWINGLY VIOLATES THIS SEC-
- 24 TION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF NOT MORE
- 25 THAN \$1,000.00 OR IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 90 DAYS, OR
- 26 BOTH.
