

SENATE BILL No. 519

March 23, 1993, Introduced by Senator EMMONS and referred to the Committee on Finance.

A bill to amend section 5a of Act No. 285 of the Public Acts of 1925, entitled as amended

"An act to provide for the organization, operation, and supervision of credit unions; to provide for the conversion of a state credit union into a federal credit union or a credit union organized and supervised under the laws of any other state or territory of the United States and for the conversion of a federal credit union or a credit union organized and supervised under the laws of any other state or territory of the United States into a state credit union; and to provide for the merger of credit unions organized and supervised under the laws of this state, credit unions organized and supervised under the laws of any other state or territory of the United States, and federal credit unions,"

as amended by Act No. 246 of the Public Acts of 1992, being section 490.5a of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Section 1. Section 5a of Act No. 285 of the Public Acts of
1925, as amended by Act No. 246 of the Public Acts of 1992, being

- 3 Sec. 5a. The shareholdings of a member who fails to com-
- 4 plete payment of 1 share within 1 year after admission to member-
- 5 ship, or of a member whose share balance is reduced to less than

- 7 value of 1 share within 1 year after the reduction, shall be
- 8 returned to the member, if the member can be located, or may be
- 9 escheated, subject to Act No. 63 of the Public Acts of 1949, as
- 10 amended, being sections 567.201 to 567.206 of the Michigan
- 11 Compiled Laws THE UNIFORM UNCLAIMED PROPERTY ACT, and the mem-
- 12 bership shall be terminated.
- 13 Section 2. This amendatory act shall take effect January 1,
- 14 1994.
- 15 Section 3. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless

- of the 87th Legislature is enacted into law.
