

# SENATE BILL No. 529

#### EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

March 25, 1993, Introduced by Senators CISKY and MC MANUS and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of military affairs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994; and for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1995; to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; to provide for certain duties of the department of military affairs, other state agencies, and local units of government; and to provide for the preparation of certain reports.

#### 1 GENERAL SECTIONS FOR FY93/94

- Sec. 201. (1) In accordance with the provisions of section 30 3 of article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending 4 in section 101 is \$44,898,400.00 and state spending to be paid to 5 units of local government is as follows:
- 6 DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AFFAIRS

- 9 (2) When it appears to the principal executive officer of each 10 department that state spending to local units of government will be 11 less than the amount that was projected to be expended for any 12 quarter, the principal executive officer shall immediately give notice 13 of the approximate shortfall to the department of management and 14 budget, the senate and house appropriations committees, and the senate 15 and house fiscal agencies.
- Sec. 202. The appropriations made and the expenditures
  17 authorized under this act and the departments, agencies, commissions,
  18 boards, offices, and programs for which an appropriation is made
  19 under this act are subject to the management and budget act, Act No.
  20 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of
  21 the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 22 Sec. 203. As used in this act:
- 23 (a) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.
- 24 (b) "FTE" means full-time equated.
- Sec. 204. The amounts appropriated for utilities and that 26 portion of contractual services, supplies, and materials used to pay 27 for utility service to state facilities in section 101 may be expended 28 in a manner consistent with the provisions of section 253 of the

1 management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, 2 being section 18.1253 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

- 3 Sec. 205. (1) Beginning October 1, 1993, there shall be a
  4 hiring freeze imposed on the state classified civil service. State
  5 departments and agencies shall be prohibited from hiring any new
  6 full-time state classified civil service employees or prohibited from
  7 filling any vacant state classified civil service positions. This
  8 hiring freeze does not apply to internal transfers of classified
  9 employees from one position to another within a department or to
  10 positions that are funded with 80% or more federal or restricted
  11 funds.
- (2) The director of the department of management and budget shall grant exceptions to this hiring freeze when the director the believes that such a hiring freeze will result in rendering a state to department or agency unable to deliver basic services. The director of the department of management and budget shall report by the fifteenth of each month to the chairpersons of the senate and house appropriations committees the number of exclusions to the hiring freeze approved during the previous month and the reasons to justify the exclusion.
- Sec. 206. All savings accruing from reduced contribution rates 22 for the state employees retirement system shall be unallotted from 23 appropriation line items as necessary. Such reductions in 24 contribution rates are contingent upon enactment of amendments to the 25 state employees retirement act of 1943, Act No. 240 of the Public Acts 26 of 1943, being sections 38.1 to 38.48 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, 27 including a defined contribution retirement plan for new state 28 employees within the membership of such plan; changes in funding for

- 1 the provision of dental and vision benefits; five year reconciliation
- 2 smoothing; use of a 50 year amortization schedule for unfunded
- 3 actuarial accrued liabilities; and other amendments to the act. The
- 4 director of the department of management and budget shall issue
- 5 instructions to all state agencies regarding contribution changes as
- 6 they occur.

## 7 HEADQUARTERS AND ARMORIES

8 Sec. 301. The department of military affairs may charge a 9 rental fee for rental activities at the garrison training centers of 10 not more than the actual cost to the department of military affairs of 11 renting the garrison training center including overtime compensation, 12 insurance coverage, and maintenance required.

#### 13 DEPARTMENTWIDE APPROPRIATIONS

Sec. 401. The Michigan veterans' memorial park commission may
15 receive and expend gifts, contributions, and bequests from any person,
16 public or private corporation, organization, foundation, governmental
17 entity, or any other source for the purpose of establishing a
18 veterans' memorial park as described in Executive Order No. 1992-12.
19 Money contributed to the Michigan veterans' memorial park commission
20 shall be deposited in the state treasury through the department of
21 military affairs and shall be available for expenditure. Project
22 costs hereby authorized shall not exceed the gifts, contributions, and
23 bequests received. Money under this section and any specific work
24 orders or projects adopted by the Michigan veterans' memorial park
25 commission in accordance with section 451(4) of the management and
26 budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section
27 18.1451 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, shall not lapse at the end of

28 this fiscal year but shall be available for expenditure until

- 1 September 30, 1996. Expenditures shall be in accordance with methods
- 2 and procedures approved by the Michigan veterans' memorial park
- 3 commission, the department of military affairs, and appropriate state
- 4 agencies.
- 5 Sec. 402. Funds available from the Michigan national guard
- 6 armory construction fund created by Act No. 307 of the Public Acts of
- 7 1992, as amended, being sections 32.768 to 32.382a of the Michigan
- 8 Compiled laws are hereby appropriated for expenditure for the purposes
- 9 specified in the above cited act as amended.

## 10 VETERANS SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS

- 11 Sec. 501. (1) The \$2,903,700.00 appropriated in section 101 for
- 12 grants to veterans service organizations shall be used only for
- 13 salaries, wages, related personnel costs, training, and equipment for
- 14 accredited veteran service advocacy officers and necessary support and
- 15 managerial staff. To receive a grant from the funds appropriated in
- 16 section 101, a veterans service organization shall comply with the
- 17 department of military affairs' requirements of accounting audits,
- 18 service work activity, accounting of recoveries, listing of volunteer
- 19 hours, and budget requests.
- 20 (2) A veterans service organization receiving a grant from the
- 21 funds appropriated in section 101 shall file with the department of
- 22 military affairs a certified accounting of its expenditures within 120
- 23 days after the organization's fiscal year end. Each organization
- 24 shall provide a detailed budget request for the fiscal year ending
- 25 September 30, 1994 to the department by November 15, 1993 within the
- 26 format as described by the department. Each organization shall
- 27 provide 5 copies of a listing of all service activity, an accounting
- 28 of recoveries, and a listing of volunteer hours for the fiscal year

1 ending September 30, 1993 to the department by January 31, 1994. A 2 veterans service organization receiving a grant from the funds 3 appropriated in section 101 shall use the forms recommended by the 4 Michigan veterans organizations' rehabilitation and veterans service 5 committee for filing reports required by this act. The department 6 shall forward information required under this section to the senate 7 and house fiscal agencies and to the senate and house appropriations 8 subcommittees on military affairs.

#### 9 GRAND RAPIDS VETERANS' FACILITY

Sec. 601. The funds appropriated in section 101 for the board 11 of managers may be expended for facility improvements, the purchase 12 and repair of equipment and furnishings, member services, and other 13 purposes which benefit the Grand Rapids veterans' facility.

## 14 D.J. JACOBETTI VETERANS' FACILITY

Sec. 701. The funds appropriated in section 101 for the board 16 of managers may be expended for facility improvements, the purchase 17 and repair of equipment and furnishings, member services, and other 18 purposes which benefit the D.J. Jacobetti veterans' facility.

- 9 (2) When it appears to the principal executive officer of each 10 department that state spending to local units of government will be 11 less than the amount that was projected to be expended for any 12 quarter, the principal executive officer shall immediately give notice 13 of the approximate shortfall to the department of management and 14 budget, the senate and house appropriations committees, and the senate 15 and house fiscal agencies.
- Sec. 1202. The appropriations made and the expenditures
  17 authorized under this act and the departments, agencies, commissions,
  18 boards, offices, and programs for which an appropriation is made
  19 under this act are subject to the management and budget act, Act No.
  20 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of
  21 the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 22 Sec. 1203. As used in this act:
- 23 (a) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.
- 24 (b) "FTE" means full-time equated.
- Sec. 1204. The amounts appropriated for utilities and that 26 portion of contractual services, supplies, and materials used to pay 27 for utility service to state facilities in section 102 may be expended 28 in a manner consistent with the provisions of section 253 of the

- 1 management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, 2 being section 18.1253 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 3 Sec. 1205. (1) Beginning October 1, 1994, there shall be a
  4 hiring freeze imposed on the state classified civil service. State
  5 departments and agencies shall be prohibited from hiring any new
  6 full-time state classified civil service employees or prohibited from
  7 filling any vacant state classified civil service positions. This
  8 hiring freeze does not apply to internal transfers of classified
  9 employees from one position to another within a department or to
  10 positions that are funded with 80% or more federal or restricted
- (2) The director of the department of management and budget

If a transfer of appropriations is 26 necessary to adjust for these increased wage levels, the director of 27 the department of management and budget may authorize administrative 28 transfers for this purpose consistent with section 393(1) of Act 431

3 Sec. 1207. All savings accruing from reduced contribution rates 4 for the state employees retirement system shall be unallotted from 5 appropriation line items as necessary. Such reductions in 6 contribution rates are contingent upon enactment of amendments to the 7 state employees retirement act of 1943, Act No. 240 of the Public Acts 8 of 1943, being sections 38.1 to 38.48 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, 9 including a defined contribution retirement plan for new state 10 employees within the membership of such plan; changes in funding for 11 the provision of dental and vision benefits; five year reconciliation 12 smoothing; use of a 50 year amortization schedule for unfunded 13 actuarial accrued liabilities; and other amendments to the act. The 14 director of the department of management and budget shall issue 15 instructions to all state agencies regarding contribution changes as 16 they occur.

## 17 HEADQUARTERS AND ARMORIES

Sec. 1301. The department of military affairs may charge a 19 rental fee for rental activities at the garrison training centers of 20 not more than the actual cost to the department of military affairs of 21 renting the garrison training center including overtime compensation, 22 insurance coverage, and maintenance required.

## 23 DEPARTMENTWIDE APPROPRIATIONS

Sec. 1401. The Michigan veterans' memorial park commission may 25 receive and expend gifts, contributions, and bequests from any person, 26 public or private corporation, organization, foundation, governmental 27 entity, or any other source for the purpose of establishing a 28 veterans' memorial park as described in Executive Order No. 1992-12.

1 Money contributed to the Michigan veterans' memorial park commission
2 shall be deposited in the state treasury through the department of
3 military affairs and shall be available for expenditure. Project
4 costs hereby authorized shall not exceed the gifts, contributions, and
5 bequests received. Money under this section and any specific work
6 orders or projects adopted by the Michigan veterans' memorial park
7 commission in accordance with section 451(4) of the management and
8 budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section
9 18.1451 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, shall not lapse at the end of
10 this fiscal year but shall be available for expenditure until
11 September 30, 1996. Expenditures shall be in accordance with methods
12 and procedures approved by the Michigan veterans' memorial park
13 commission, the department of military affairs, and appropriate state
14 agencies.

Sec. 1402. Funds available from the Michigan national guard 16 armory construction fund created by Act No. 307 of the Public Acts of 17 1992, as amended, being sections 32.768 to 32.382a of the Michigan 18 Compiled laws are hereby appropriated for expenditure for the purposes 19 specified in the above cited act as amended.

## 20 VETERANS SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS

Sec. 1501. (1) The \$2,903,700.00 appropriated in section 102
22 for grants to veterans service organizations shall be used only for
23 salaries, wages, related personnel costs, training, and equipment for
24 accredited veteran service advocacy officers and necessary support and
25 managerial staff. To receive a grant from the funds appropriated in
26 section 102, a veterans service organization shall comply with the
27 department of military affairs' requirements of accounting audits,
28 service work activity, accounting of recoveries, listing of volunteer

1 hours, and budget requests.

2 A veterans service organization receiving a grant from the 3 funds appropriated in section 102 shall file with the department of 4 military affairs a certified accounting of its expenditures within 120 5 days after the organization's fiscal year end. Each organization 6 shall provide a detailed budget request for the fiscal year ending 7 September 30, 1995 to the department by November 15, 1994 within the 8 format as described by the department. Each organization shall 9 provide 5 copies of a listing of all service activity, an accounting 10 of recoveries, and a listing of volunteer hours for the fiscal year 11 ending September 30, 1994 to the department by January 31, 1995. 12 veterans service organization receiving a grant from the funds 13 appropriated in section 102 shall use the forms recommended by the 14 Michigan veterans organizations' rehabilitation and veterans service 15 committee for filing reports required by this act. The department 16 shall forward information required under this section to the senate 17 and house fiscal agencies and to the senate and house appropriations 18 subcommittees on military affairs.

## 19 GRAND RAPIDS VETERANS' FACILITY

Sec. 1601. The funds appropriated in section 102 for the board 21 of managers may be expended for facility improvements, the purchase 22 and repair of equipment and furnishings, member services, and other 23 purposes which benefit the Grand Rapids veterans' facility.

#### 24 D.J. JACOBETTI VETERANS' FACILITY

Sec. 1701. The funds appropriated in section 102 for the board 26 of managers may be expended for facility improvements, the purchase 27 and repair of equipment and furnishings, member services, and other 28 purposes which benefit the D.J. Jacobetti veterans' facility.
