

SENATE BILL No. 629

May 6, 1993, Introduced by Senators HOLMES, BERRYMAN, CONROY, CHERRY, FAXON, KOIVISTO, POLLACK, VAUGHN, KELLY, FAUST, HART, STABENOW, SMITH and O'BRIEN and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend section 3 of Act No. 2 of the Public Acts of 1921, entitled

"An act to promote the efficiency of the government of the state, to create a state administrative board, to define the powers and duties thereof, to provide for the transfer to said board of powers and duties now vested by law in other boards, commissions, departments and officers of the state, and for the abolishing of certain of the boards, commissions, departments and offices, whose powers and duties are hereby transferred,"

being section 17.3 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Section 3 of Act No. 2 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1921, being section 17.3 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 3. (1) The state administrative board shall exercise
- 5 general supervisory control over the functions and activities of
- 6 all administrative departments, boards, -commissioners-
- 7 COMMISSIONS, and officers of the state, and of all state

- 2 1 institutions. -- Provided, however, The said HOWEVER, THE 2 board shall not have power to transfer any appropriation to the 3 general fund at any time or use the same for any purpose other 4 than that designated by the legislature. -: Provided further, 5 That said THE board shall not have power to allow to any state 6 department, board, commission, officer, or institution any funds 7 — not appropriated — therefor— by the legislature — from any 8 source whatever. -, except as provided in the emergency appro-9 priation act of 1931; and said administrative THE board shall 10 not have the power to transfer to any state department, board, 11 commission, officer, or institution any sum from the amount 12 appropriated by the legislature for any other purpose. -, except 13 to inter transfer funds within the appropriation for the particu-14 lar department, board, commission, officer or institution. Said-(2) THE board may in its discretion intervene in any matter
- 16 touching such functions and activities and may, by resolution or
- 17 order, advise or direct the department, board, commission,
- 18 officer, or institution concerned as to the manner in which the
- 19 function or other activity shall be performed, and may order an
- 20 interchange or transfer of employees between departments, boards,
- 22 hereby made the duty of each and every AN official -and OR
- 23 employee connected with any administrative department, BOARD,
- 24 COMMISSION, office, or institution of the state -to- SHALL follow
- 25 the direction or order -so- given -r and -to- SHALL perform such
- 26 services in the carrying out of the purposes and intent of this
- 27 act as may be required by the board. Failure -so- to do SO shall

- 1 be -deemed CONSIDERED to constitute malfeasance in office and
- 2 shall be sufficient cause for removal.
