

SENATE BILL No. 647

May 18, 1993, Introduced by Senators MC MANUS, KOIVISTO, GAST, EMMONS, HART, SCHWARZ, CISKY and CARL and referred to the Committee on Transportation and Tourism.

A bill to amend sections 4 and 6 of Act No. 3 of the Public Acts of 1939, entitled as amended

"An act to provide for the regulation and control of public utilities and other services affected with a public interest within this state; to create a public service commission and to prescribe and define its powers and duties; to abolish the Michigan public utilities commission and to confer the powers and duties vested by law therein on the public service commission; to provide for the continuance, transfer, and completion of certain matters and proceedings; to abolish automatic adjustment clauses; to prohibit rate increases without notice and hearing; to qualify residential energy conservation programs permitted under state law for certain federal exemption; to provide for a restructuring of rates for certain utilities; to encourage the utilization of resource recovery facilities; to provide for appeals; to provide appropriations; to declare the effect of this act; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal all acts contrary to this act,"

- 1 Section 1. Sections 4 and 6 of Act No. 3 of the Public Acts
- 2 of 1939, section 4 as amended by Act No. 4 of the Public Acts of
- 3 1987 and section 6 as amended by Act No. 37 of the Public Acts of
- 4 1992, being sections 460.4 and 460.6 of the Michigan Compiled
- 5 Laws, are amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 4. The Michigan public utilities commission is
- 7 abolished. All the rights, powers, and duties vested by law in
- 8 the Michigan public utilities commission shall be transferred to
- 9 and vested in the Michigan public service commission created in
- 10 section 1, and shall be exercised and performed by it. The
- 11 Michigan public service commission shall have and exercise all
- 12 rights, privileges, and the jurisdiction in all respects as has
- 13 been conferred by law and exercised by the Michigan public utili-
- 14 ties commission. Where reference is or has been made in any law
- 15 to the "commission", -or to the "Michigan public utilities
- 16 commission", -or the "Michigan railroad commission", that refer-
- 17 ence shall be construed to mean the Michigan public service com-
- 18 mission EXCEPT THAT WITH RESPECT TO RAILROAD, BRIDGE, AND TUNNEL
- 19 COMPANIES, THAT REFERENCE SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO MEAN THE STATE
- 20 TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT. Any order or decree of the Michigan
- 21 public service commission STATE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT WITH
- 22 RESPECT TO RAILROAD, BRIDGE, AND TUNNEL COMPANIES shall be
- 23 subject to review in the manner provided for in THE RAILROAD CODE
- 24 OF 1993. section 26 of Act No. 300 of the Public Acts of 1909,
- 25 being section 462.26 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. Appeals from
- 26 orders of the Michigan public utilities commission initiated
- 27 under the provisions of any other act and now pending in any

- 1 court shall not be dismissed, terminated, or abated, but shall be
- 2 continued, carried on, and completed exactly as though this sec-
- 3 tion had been in effect at the time the appeals were taken and
- 4 the appeals had been initiated pursuant to this section. The
- 5 Michigan public service commission shall be substituted as
- 6 defendant in those causes.
- 7 Sec. 6. -(1)— The public service commission is vested with
- 8 complete power and jurisdiction to regulate all public utilities
- 9 in the state except a municipally owned utility, the owner of a
- 10 renewable resource power production facility as provided in sec-
- 11 tion 6d, and except as otherwise restricted by law. The public
- 12 service commission is vested with the power and jurisdiction to
- 13 regulate all rates, fares, fees, charges, services, rules, condi-
- 14 tions of service, and all other matters pertaining to the forma-
- 15 tion, operation, or direction of public utilities. The public
- 16 service commission is further granted the power and jurisdiction
- 17 to hear and pass upon all matters pertaining to, necessary, or
- 18 incident to the regulation of public utilities, including elec-
- 19 tric light and power companies, whether private, corporate, or
- 20 cooperative; water, telegraph, oil, gas, and pipeline companies;
- 21 motor carriers; and all public transportation and communication
- 22 agencies other than railroads and railroad companies.
- 23 (2) The commission has the same measure of authority with
- 24 respect to railroads and railroad companies as is granted and
- 25 conferred under the law creating the Michigan railroad commission
- 26 and its successor, the Michigan public utilities commission, and
- 27 defining their powers and duties.
