EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

January 25, 1994, Introduced by Senators Geake and Gast and referred to the Committee on Appropriations

A bill to make appropriations for the department of mental health and certain state purposes related to mental hygiene for the fiscal year ending September 30 1995 to provide for the expenditure of such appropriations to create funds to provide for reports to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and departments and to provide for disp sition of fees and other income received by the various state agencies
