A bill to amend sections 356c and 356d of Act No 328 of the Public Acts of 1931, entitled as amended
"The Michigan penal code,"
as added by Act No 20 of the Public Acts of 1988, being sections

750 356c and 750 356d of the Michigan Compiled Laws and to add section 356e

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT

- Section 1 Sections 356c and 356d of Act No 328 of the
- 2 Public Acts of 1931 as added by Act No 20 of the Public Acts of
- 3 1988, being sections 750 356c and 750 356d of the Michigan
- 4 Compiled Laws, are amended and section 356e is added to read as
- 5 follows
- 6 Sec 356c (1) A person who does any of the following in a
- 7 store or in its immediate vicinity is quilty of retail fraud in
- 8 the first degree, a felony punishable by imprisonment for not

- 1 more than 2 years, or a fine of not more than \$1,000 00, or
- 2 both
- 3 (a) While a store is open to the public, alters, transfers,
- 4 removes and replaces, conceals, or otherwise misrepresents the
- 5 price at which property is offered for sale, with the intent not
- 6 to pay for the property or to pay less than the price at which
- 7 the property is offered for sale, if the resulting difference in
- 8 price is -more than \$100-00 \$1,000 00 OR MORE
- 9 (b) While a store is open to the public, steals property of
- 10 the store that is offered for sale at a price of -more than
- 11 \$100 00 \$1,000 00 OR MORE
- 12 (c) With intent to defraud, obtains or attempts to obtain
- 13 money or property from the store as a refund or exchange for
- 14 property that was not paid for and belongs to the store, if the
- 15 amount of money, or the value of the property, obtained or
- 16 attempted to be obtained is -more than \$100-00 \$1,000 00 OR
- 17 MORE
- 18 (2) A person who violates section 356d OR 356E and has 1 or
- 19 more prior convictions under this section, section 218, 356
- 20 356d, or 360 or a local ordinance substantially corresponding to
- 21 this section or section 218, 356, 356d, or 360 is guilty of
- 22 retail fraud in the first degree
- 23 (3) A person who commits the crime of retail fraud in the
- 24 first degree shall not be prosecuted under the felony provision
- 25 of section 356, or under section 218 or 360
- 26 Sec 356d (1) A person who does any of the following in a
- 27 store or in its immediate vicinity is guilty of retail fraud in

- 1 the second degree, a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for
- 2 not more than 93 days, or a fine of not more than \$\frac{\$100 00}{}
- 3 \$500 00, or both
- 4 (a) While a store is open to the public, alters, transfers,
- 5 removes and replaces, conceals, or otherwise misrepresents the
- 6 price at which property is offered for sale, with the intent not
- 7 to pay for the property or to pay less than the price at which
- 8 the property is offered for sale, IF THE RESULTING DIFFERENCE IN
- 9 PRICE IS \$100 00 OR MORE BUT LESS THAN \$1,000 00
- 10 (b) While a store is open to the public, steals property of
- 11 the store that is offered for sale AT A PRICE OF \$100 00 OR MORE
- 12 BUT LESS THAN \$1,000 00
- 13 (c) With intent to defraud, obtains or attempts to obtain
- 14 money or property from the store as a refund or exchange for
- 15 property that was not paid for and belongs to the store IF THE
- 16 AMOUNT OF THE MONEY, OR THE VALUE OF THE PROPERTY, OBTAINED OR
- 17 ATTEMPTED TO BE OBTAINED IS \$100 00 OR MORE BUT LESS THAN
- 18 \$1,000 00
- 19 (2) A person who commits the crime of retail fraud in the
- 20 second degree shall not be prosecuted under the felony provision
- 21 of section 356, or under section 218 or 360
- 22 SEC 356E (1) A PERSON WHO DOES ANY OF THE FOLLOWING IN A
- 23 STORE OR IN ITS IMMEDIATE VICINITY IS GUILTY OF RETAIL FRAUD IN
- 24 THE THIRD DEGREE, A MISDEMEANOR PUNISHABLE BY IMPRISONMENT FOR
- 25 NOT MORE THAN 93 DAYS, OR A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$100 00, OR
- **26** BOTH

- 1 (A) WHILE A STORE IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC ALTERS TRANSFERS,
- 2 REMOVES AND REPLACES, CONCEALS, OR OTHERWISE MISREPRESENTS THE
- 3 PRICE AT WHICH PROPERTY IS OFFERED FOR SALE, WITH THE INTENT NOT
- 4 TO PAY FOR THE PROPERTY OR TO PAY LESS THAN THE PRICE AT WHICH
- 5 THE PROPERTY IS OFFERED FOR SALE IF THE RESULTING DIFFERENCE IN
- 6 PRICE IS LESS THAN \$100 00
- 7 (B) WHILE A STORE IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC, STEALS PROPERTY OF
- 8 THE STORE THAT IS OFFERED FOR SALE AT A PRICE OF LESS THAN
- 9 \$100 00
- 10 (C) WITH INTENT TO DEFRAUD, OBTAINS OR ATTEMPTS TO OBTAIN
- 11 MONEY OR PROPERTY FROM THE STORE AS A REFUND OR EXCHANGE FOR
- 12 PROPERTY THAT WAS NOT PAID FOR AND BELONGS TO THE STORE IF THE
- 13 AMOUNT OF THE MONEY, OR THE VALUE OF THE PROPERTY, OBTAINED OR
- 14 ATTEMPTED TO BE OBTAINED IS LESS THAN \$100 00
- 15 (2) A PERSON WHO COMMITS THE CRIME OF RETAIL FRAUD IN THE
- 16 THIRD DEGREE SHALL NOT BE PROSECUTED UNDER THE FELONY PROVISION
- 17 OF SECTION 356 OR UNDER SECTION 218 OR 360
- Section 2 This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
- 19 all of the following bills of the 87th Legislature are enacted
- 20 into law
