A bill to amend section 6 of Act No 451 of the Public Acts
of 1976, entitled as amended

"The school code of 1976,"

as amended by Act No 159 of the Public Acts of 1989 being sec-
tion 380 6 of the Michigan Compiled Laws

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT

1 Section 1 Section 6 of Act No 451 of the Public Acts of
2 1976 as amended by Act No 159 of the Public Acts of 1989 being
3 section 380 6 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read
4 as follows

5 Sec 6 (1) "School bus" means a motor vehicle other than
6 a station wagon or passenger van, with a manufacturer's rated
7 seating capacity of 17 or more pupils used for the transportation
8 of school pupils to and from school ~~which~~ THAT either is owned
9 by a school district or, if privately owned, is transporting

1 school pupils under a contract with a local school district, a
2 local act school district, or an intermediate school district
3 As used in this subsection

4 (a) "Passenger van" means a motor vehicle designed to carry
5 not more than 16 passengers, built on a truck chassis, and regis-
6 tered and titled by the secretary of state as a station wagon

7 (b) "Station wagon" means a motor vehicle designed to carry
8 not more than 10 passengers and built on a passenger vehicle
9 chassis

10 (2) "School district" or "local school district" means

11 (a) A primary school district

12 (b) A school district of the fourth class

13 (c) A school district of the third class

14 (d) A school district of the second class

15 (e) A school district of the first class

16 (3) "School elector" means a person qualified as an elector
17 under section 492 of the Michigan election law Act No 116 of
18 the Public Acts of 1954, as amended, being section 168 492 of the
19 Michigan Compiled Laws, and resident of the school district
20 local act school district, or intermediate school district on or
21 before the thirtieth day before the next ensuing annual or spe-
22 cial school election FOR PURPOSES OF REGISTERING TO VOTE AND
23 VOTING AT AN ELECTION, SPECIAL ELECTION, OR PRIMARY ELECTION ON A
24 REAL PROPERTY TAX ISSUE OR A LOCAL PROPOSAL, LOCAL QUESTION, OR
25 LOCAL OFFICE ONLY, A PERSON IS CONSIDERED A RESIDENT OF THE
26 SCHOOL DISTRICT, LOCAL ACT SCHOOL DISTRICT, OR INTERMEDIATE
27 SCHOOL DISTRICT TO BE AFFECTED BY THE RESULT OF THAT ELECTION IF

1 THAT PERSON OWNS, AND HAS PAID ALL ASSESSED AD VALOREM PROPERTY
2 TAXES ON, REAL PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, LOCAL ACT
3 SCHOOL DISTRICT OR INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICT

4 (4) "School month" means a 4-week period of 5 days each
5 unless otherwise specified in the ~~teacher's~~ TEACHERS'
6 contract

7 (5) "Special education building and equipment" means a
8 structure or portion of a structure or personal property accept-
9 ed, leased, purchased, or otherwise acquired, prepared, or used
10 for special education programs and services

11 (6) "Special education personnel" means persons engaged in
12 and having professional responsibility for the training, care,
13 and education of handicapped persons in special education pro-
14 grams and services including, but not limited to, teachers,
15 aides, social workers, diagnostic personnel, physical therapists
16 occupational therapists, audiologists, teachers of speech and
17 language, instructional media-curriculum specialists, mobility
18 specialists, teacher consultants, supervisors, and directors

19 (7) "Special education programs and services" means educa-
20 tional and training services designed for ~~handicappers~~
21 HANDICAPPED PERSONS and operated by local school districts, local
22 act school districts, intermediate school districts, the Michigan
23 school for the blind, the Michigan school for the deaf the
24 department of mental health, the department of social services
25 or a combination thereof, and ancillary professional services for
26 ~~handicappers~~ HANDICAPPED PERSONS rendered by agencies approved
27 by the state board The programs shall include vocational

1 training, but need not include academic programs of college or
2 university level

3 (8) "State approved nonpublic school" means a nonpublic
4 school that complies with Act No 302 of the Public Acts of 1921,
5 as amended being sections 388 551 to 388 558 of the Michigan
6 Compiled Laws

7 (9) "State board" means the state board of education unless
8 clearly otherwise stated

9 (10) "Department" means the department of education created
10 and operating under sections 300 to 305 of the executive organi-
11 zation act of 1965, Act No 380 of the Public Acts of 1965, being
12 sections 16 400 to 16 405 of the Michigan Compiled Laws

13 (11) "State school aid" means allotments from the general
14 appropriating act ~~for the purpose of aiding~~ TO AID in the sup-
15 port of the public schools of ~~the~~ THIS state

16 (12) "The state school aid act of 1979" means Act No 94 of
17 the Public Acts of 1979 being sections 388 1601 to 388 1772 of
18 the Michigan Compiled Laws

19 (13) "Type I school bus" means a school bus with a gross
20 vehicle weight rating of more than 10 000 pounds

21 (14) "Type II school bus" means a school bus with a gross
22 vehicle WEIGHT rating of 10,000 pounds or less

23 (15) "Type I premium school bus" means a school bus with a
24 passenger capacity of more than 66 pupils and any other school
25 bus purchased by a district at a cost for the vehicle, excluding
26 interest and special equipment, that exceeds by more than 15% the

- 1 average cost of a school bus meeting state minimum specifications
- 2 of the same capacity purchased during the same year

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
