A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 5828 AS INTRODUCED 4-30-96

Under the Mental Health Code, a person, such as a relative, physician, or police officer, can petition a court to hold a hearing to determine another individual's need for mental health treatment or for a finding of incompetency. Unless the petitioner has retained private counsel who will appear in court and present the case, the prosecuting attorney of the county in which the court has its principal office (or his or her assistant) is required to participate in the hearings convened by the court in his or her county. House Bill 5828 would allow a prosecuting attorney or assistant from another county to take the place of the principal county prosecutor or his or her assistant.
