CONTENT

Senate Bill 937 would amend Chapter 83 of the Revised Statutes of 1846 (entitled "Of marriage" and the solemnization thereof) to specify that marriage "is a civil contract between a man and a woman" and to prohibit a man from marrying another man, and prohibit a woman from marrying another woman.

Currently, Chapter 83 specifies that marriage, so far as its validity in law is concerned, is a civil contract, to which the consent of parties capable in law of contracting, is essential.

Senate Bill 938 would amend Public Act 168 of 1939, which provides for the validation of marriages contracted by residents of the State and solemnized in another state by authorized persons, to limit its provisions to marriages contracted between a man and a woman, and to specify that the provisions validating out-of-State marriages would not apply to a marriage contracted between individuals of the same sex, which marriage would be invalid in this State.

Senate Bill 938 is tie-barred to Senate Bill 937.
