AN ACT to repeal Act No. 148 of the Public Acts of 1893, entitled "An act to prohibit the opening of barber shops on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, for the purpose of carrying on or engaging in the art or calling of hair cutting, shaving, hair dressing and shampooing, or in any work pertaining to the trade or business of a barber, on the said first day of the week, commonly called Sunday," being sections 338.681 to 338.683 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Section 1. Act No. 148 of the Public Acts of 1893, being sections 338.681 to 338.683 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is repealed.
