AN ACT to make appropriations for the department of natural resources and the department of environmental quality for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1996; to provide for the acquisition of land and development rights; to provide for certain work projects; to provide for the development of public recreation facilities; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials; and to provide for the expenditure of appropriations.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Sec. 1. There is appropriated for the department of natural resources to supplement former appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1996, the sum of \$20,714,100.00 for land acquisition and grants and \$5,688,800.00 for public recreation facility development and grants as provided in section 35 of article IX of the state constitution of 1963 and part 19 (natural resources trust fund) of the natural resources and environmental protection act, Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1994, being sections 324.1901 to 324.1910 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, from the following funds:

Sec. 3. The department of natural resources shall enter into agreements with local units of government for the purpose of administering the grants identified in section 1. Among other provisions, the agreements shall require that grant recipients agree to dedicate to public recreation uses in perpetuity the land acquired; to replace lands converted or lost to other than public recreation use; and to convey to the state any mineral interests acquired by the grant recipient with an exception allowed for a share of the mineral interests acquired, which share is based on the portion of the fair market value of the property that was provided by the local cash contribution of the grant recipient. The agreements shall also provide the full payments of grants be made only after proof of acquisition is submitted by the grant recipient and all costs are verified by the department of natural resources.

Sec. 4. The department of natural resources shall take steps necessary to make available federal or other funds that may become available for the purpose for which appropriations are made in section 1, and to use any or all of the appropriations to meet matching requirements which are determined to be in the best interest of the state.

Sec. 5. Any unobligated balance in any appropriation made under section 1 shall not revert to the fund from which appropriated at the close of the fiscal year, but shall continue for a period not to exceed 3 fiscal years until the purpose for which it was appropriated is completed or left unexpended at the conclusion of 3 fiscal years. The unexpended balance of any appropriation made in section 1 remaining after the purpose for which it was appropriated is completed shall revert to the Michigan natural resources trust fund and be made available for appropriation.

- Sec. 6. If a person or organization has acquired an option on a parcel of property prior to final determination by the department of natural resources and the Michigan natural resources trust fund board, the property shall not be considered for acquisition unless the department and board can demonstrate that a clear recreational advantage exists in obtaining the parcel of property for the people of the state at a reasonable fair market value.
- Sec. 7. As required by section 1903(3) of part 19 (natural resources trust fund) of the natural resources and environmental protection act, Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1994, being section 324.1903 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, the grants-in-aid to local units of government shall be awarded pursuant to this act.
- Sec. 8. The appropriation in section 1.A. (priority no. 19) for boating lump sum access sites acquisition (#95-305) shall not be expended for land acquisition on a lake not specifically identified.
- Sec. 9. The combined total of state dollars expended for purchase of development rights easement acquisition under section 1.A. shall not exceed \$5,000.00 per acre.
- Sec. 10. If money that was placed into escrow under the consent decree in the consolidated cases of Kelley v Mueller Brass Corporation, Civil Action No. 92-71200-CE, and PIRGIM v Mueller Brass Corporation, Civil Action No. 92-71199-CE, is released to the state upon termination of escrow pursuant to that consent decree, that money shall be deposited into the natural resources trust fund. Money deposited in the natural resources trust fund pursuant to this section shall be appropriated as "Natural resources trust fund St. Clair county legal settlement" for the acquisition of property as defined in the original escrow agreement.

- Sec. 22. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized under this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards, offices, and programs for which an appropriation is made under this act are subject to the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- Sec. 23. For all projects and grant programs funded under this act, the department of environmental quality shall notify each legislator whose district is to receive a grant 7 days before the grants are announced.
- Sec. 24. It is the intent of the legislature that the state shall make bonds issued pursuant to part 195 (environmental protection bond implementation) of the natural resources and environmental protection act, Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1994, being sections 324.19501 to 324.19513 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, available to the citizens of the state by making a portion of the bonds available in denominations of \$500.00 or less, and shall otherwise encourage the participation of the citizens of the state in the investment in environmental protection bonds.
- Sec. 25. The unexpended portion of the appropriation in section 11 for the environmental bond projects is considered work project appropriations and any unencumbered or unallotted funds are carried forward into the succeeding fiscal

year. The following is in compliance with section 451(3) of the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section 18.1451 of the Michigan Compiled Laws:

- (a) The purpose of the environmental bond projects to be carried forward is to provide toxic waste cleanup, management of solid wastes, and increased water protection.
 - (b) These projects will be accomplished by contract.
 - (c) The total estimated costs of all projects is identified in each line item appropriation.
 - (d) The tentative completion date for these projects is September 30, 1997.

ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE

- Sec. 31. (1) The department of environmental quality shall annually report to the governor, the house of representatives and senate appropriations subcommittees on natural resources and environmental quality, the joint capital outlay subcommittee, the house of representatives and senate standing committees with jurisdiction over issues related to the environment and natural resources, and the house and senate fiscal agencies on the progress of the environmental protection bond cleanups for which appropriations have been made under this act. This report shall include the criteria used for site selection; a list of sites funded, including the name, address, county, and telephone number of the recipient or participant; bond funded actions taken at each site; other sources of funds used at each site in addition to bond proceeds, including private actions or responsible party actions; the amount of funds committed for each site and actually expended at each site; further cleanup actions that may be anticipated at each site; and other information considered pertinent by the department of environmental quality.
- (2) The annual report required under subsection (1) shall include a summary of all of the sites funded, organized by the type of remedial action undertaken at the site as follows: surface cleanup, alternative water supply, municipal water supply, site investigation, final cleanup design, final cleanup, operation and maintenance, and superfund cleanup project match. The report shall also include the sources of funding for each site, the amount of funds committed for each site and actually expended at each site, the estimated amount of funds saved because of private actions and responsible parties, and staff costs associated with each site.
- Sec. 32. The expenditure of money under this act does not preclude the use of private, federal, local, or other state funds on these projects.
- Sec. 33. In addition to the funds appropriated for environmental response projects listed in section 11, additional funds are authorized for expenditures from appropriations contained in Act No. 180 of the Public Acts of 1989, Act No. 55 of the Public Acts of 1990, Act No. 194 of the Public Acts of 1990, Act No. 31 of the Public Acts of 1991, Act No. 160 of the Public Acts of 1991, Act No. 74 of the Public Acts of 1993, Act No. 353 of the Public Acts of 1993, and Act No. 442 of the Public Acts of 1994, for the environmental response program with funding support from the environmental protection bond fund. The department of environmental quality shall provide to the senate and house of representatives appropriations subcommittees on natural resources by October 30, 1996 a list documenting funds saved per site from previous appropriations and the reallocation of those funds for fiscal year 1995-96.
- Sec. 34. The appropriation in section 11 for contingency fund shall not be encumbered or expended until the department of environmental quality has reported to the senate and house of representatives appropriations subcommittees on natural resources those projects that have been approved under this program.

Sec. 35. (1) The amounts appropriated from the following fiscal years for the activities specified shall be reappropriated for response activities listed in subsection (2).
