February 9, 1995, Introduced by Reps. Bankes, Berman, Jellema, Dolan, Middleton and Yokich and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

- Sec. 201. In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of arti-
- 3 cle IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending from state
- 4 resources for the fiscal period April 1, 1995 to September 30, 1995 is
- 5 \$17,100,000.00 and the state appropriations to be paid to units of local
- 6 governments in section 102 are as follows:

FISCAL PERIOD 1995 BOILERPLATE

- Sec. 301. Agencies which currently receive pregnancy prevention
- 3 funds and either receive or are eligible for other family planning funds
- 4 shall have the option of receiving all of their family planning funds
- 5 directly from the department of public health and be designated as dele-
- 6 gate agencies.
- Sec. 302. The department shall ensure that outreach networks sup-
- 8 ported with funds appropriated in section 101 for chronic disease preven-
- g tion shall cover a regional area that would serve more than 3 counties.
- Sec. 303. The funds appropriated in section 101 for physical fit-
- 11 ness, nutrition, and health shall not be used for per diem reimbursement
- 12 to members of the governor's council on physical fitness.
- 13 Sec. 304. The funds appropriated in section 101 for physical fit-
- 14 ness, nutrition, and health shall be distributed for the purpose of life-
- 15 time physical fitness. These activities shall include, but are not
- 16 limited to, walking, jogging, aerobics, swimming, bicycling, weight
- 17 training, stretching, and dance. The funds shall not be used to support
- 18 team sports activities.
- 19 Sec. 305. The healthy Michigan fund act requires that healthy
- 20 Michigan funds shall be utilized to improve the public health of the cit-
- 21 izens of Michigan. All unexpended funds shall lapse to the healthy
- 22 Michigan fund and be available for appropriation in the following fiscal
- 23 year.
- 24 Sec. 306. The department of public health shall develop RFP quide-
- 25 lines for funds to be distributed under the tobacco tax. The guidelines
- 26 shall provide opportunities for funding by nongovernmental agencies. The
- 27 department shall not specify funding for any particular type of

- 1 organization, except that line item that is identified as funding for
- 2 local health departments. Where line item appropriations are awarded
- 3 through an RFP process, the most appropriate agency or agencies agreeing
- 4 to meet the department's quidelines shall be chosen. Local health
- 5 departments may be offered the opportunity to administer funds to commu-
- 6 nity based organizations, when the local health department is deemed
- 7 appropriate and agrees to administer the contract in accordance with the
- 8 department's quidance.
- 9 Sec. 307. The funds appropriated in section 101 for pregnancy pre-
- 10 vention programs shall not be used to provide abortion counseling, refer-
- 11 rals, or services.
- 12 Sec. 308. The state departments, agencies, and commissions receiv-
- 13 ing funds from section 101 shall report quarterly beginning April 1,
- 14 1995, to the senate and house appropriations committees, the senate and
- 15 house fiscal agencies, and the department of management and budget on the
- 16 following:
- (a) Detailed spending plan by appropriation line item including
- 18 description of programs.
- (b) Allocations from funds appropriated under these sections.
- 20 (c) Description of allocations or bid processes including need or
- 21 demand indicators used to determine allocations.
- 22 (d) Eligibility criteria for program participation and maximum bene-
- 23 fit levels where applicable.
- (e) Outcome measures to be used to evaluate programs.
- 25 (f) Any other information deemed necessary by the house or senate
- 26 appropriations committees or the department of management and budget.

- Sec. 309. Of the funds appropriated in section 101 for tobacco free michigan, not less than \$50,000.00 shall be allocated for prenatal smoking cessation programs.
- Sec. 310. From the funds appropriated in section 101 for tobacco free Michigan, a maximum of 2.5% shall be allocated to adolescent health care centers that currently provide smoking prevention programs. These funds shall be distributed under the current adolescent health center allocation formula.
- 9 Sec. 311. (1) The funds appropriated in section 101 for violence 10 prevention shall be used for, but not be limited to, the following:
- (a) Programs aimed at the prevention of spouse, partner, or child 12 abuse and rape.
- (b) Programs aimed at the prevention of workplace violence.
- 14 (2) The emphasis of programs supported with the funds appropriated 15 in section 101 for violence prevention and for the state coordinating 16 council on violence shall be on prevention.
- 17 (3) In awarding grants from the amounts appropriated in section 102 18 for violence prevention, the department shall give equal consideration to 19 public and private nonprofit applicants.
- Sec. 312. From the funds appropriated in section 101 for physical 21 fitness, nutrition, and health, up to \$1,000,000.00 may be allocated to 22 the Michigan physical fitness and sports foundation. The allocation to 23 the Michigan physical fitness and sports foundation is contingent upon 24 the foundation providing at least a 20% cash match.
- 25 Sec. 313. Of the funds appropriated in section 101 for poison con-26 trol, the department of public health may transfer \$150,000.00 to the 27 department of social services.

- 1 Sec. 314. The department of social services shall distribute
- 2 \$387,550.00 to children's hospitals that have a high indigent care volume
- 3 if the department receives a \$150,000.00 interdepartmental grant from the
- 4 department of public health. The amount to be distributed, if any, to
- 5 any given hospital shall be based on a formula determined by the depart-
- 6 ment of social services.
- 7 Sec. 315. If federal medicaid revenues are earned in the family
- 8 planning program under a federal family planning medicaid waiver, amounts
- 9 appropriated from the tobacco tax equivalent to the federal medicaid
- 10 earnings shall be allocated on a quarterly basis as follows:
- 11 (a) 50% for violence prevention.
- 12 (b) 25% for adolescent health care services.
- 13 (c) 10% for dental programs.
- (d) 15% for prenatal care outreach and service delivery support.
- 15 Sec. 316. The use of state restricted tobacco tax revenue received
- 16 for the purpose of tobacco prevention, education, and reduction efforts
- 17 and deposited in the healthy Michigan fund shall not be used for lobbying
- 18 as that term is defined in section 5 of Act No. 472 of the Public Acts of
- 19 1978, being section 4.415 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
