



HOUSE BILL No. 4831

May 16, 1995, Introduced by Reps. Hill and Gustafson and referred to the Committee on Public Utilities.

A bill to amend section 102 of Act No. 32 of the Public Acts of 1986, entitled as amended "Emergency telephone service enabling act," as amended by Act No. 29 of the Public Acts of 1994, being section 484.1102 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Section 102 of Act No. 32 of the Public Acts of
2 1986, as amended by Act No. 29 of the Public Acts of 1994, being
3 section 484.1102 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to
4 read as follows:

5 Sec. 102. As used in this act:

6 (a) "Automatic location identification" or "ALI" means a
7 9-1-1 service feature in which the service supplier automatically
8 forwards the name or address, or both, associated with the

1 calling party's telephone number as identified by automatic
2 number identification, to the public safety answering point.

3 (b) "Automatic number identification" or "ANI" means a 9-1-1
4 service feature in which the service supplier automatically for-
5 wards the calling party's billing telephone number to the public
6 safety answering point for display.

7 (c) "Consolidated dispatch" means a countywide or regional
8 emergency dispatch service that provides dispatch service for 75%
9 or more of the law enforcement, fire fighting, emergency medical
10 service, and other emergency service agencies within the geo-
11 graphical area of a 9-1-1 service district or serves 75% or more
12 of the population within a 9-1-1 service district.

13 (d) "Direct dispatch method" means ~~the method of responding~~
14 ~~to a telephone request for public safety service whereby~~ THAT
15 the agency receiving the 9-1-1 call at the public safety answer-
16 ing point decides on the proper action to be taken and dispatches
17 the appropriate available public safety service unit located
18 closest to the request for public safety service.

19 (e) "Emergency telephone charge" means emergency telephone
20 operational charge and emergency telephone technical charge.

21 (f) "Emergency telephone district" or "9-1-1 service
22 district" means the area in which 9-1-1 service is provided or is
23 planned to be provided to service users under a 9-1-1 system
24 implemented ~~pursuant to~~ UNDER this act.

25 (g) "Emergency telephone district board" means the governing
26 body created by the board of commissioners of the county or

1 counties with authority over an emergency telephone district.
2 ~~as prescribed by the county or counties that created the board.~~

3 (h) "Emergency telephone operational charge" means a charge
4 for nonnetwork technical equipment and other costs directly
5 related to the operation of 1 or more PSAPs including, but not
6 limited to, dispatch personnel. EMERGENCY TELEPHONE OPERATIONAL
7 CHARGE DOES NOT INCLUDE NON-PSAP RELATED COSTS SUCH AS RESPONSE
8 VEHICLES AND OTHER PERSONNEL.

9 ~~Costs associated with non-PSAP operation such as response~~
10 ~~vehicles and personnel shall not be included in those assessments~~
11 ~~levied under this act.~~

12 (i) "Emergency telephone technical charge" means a charge
13 for the network start-up costs, customer notification costs,
14 billing costs including an allowance for uncollectibles for tech-
15 nical and operational charges, and network nonrecurring and
16 recurring installation, maintenance, service, and equipment
17 charges of a service supplier providing 9-1-1 service ~~pursuant~~
18 ~~to~~ UNDER this act.

19 (j) "Exchange access facility" means the access from a par-
20 ticular service user's premises to the telephone system.
21 Exchange access facilities include service supplier provided
22 access lines, PBX trunks, and centrex line trunk equivalents, all
23 as defined by tariffs of the service suppliers as approved by the
24 public service commission. Exchange access facilities do not
25 include ~~service supplier owned and operated~~ telephone pay sta-
26 tion lines ~~or~~ WATS, FX, or incoming only lines.

1 (k) "Final 9-1-1 service plan" means a tentative 9-1-1
2 service plan that has been modified only to reflect necessary
3 changes resulting from any exclusions of public agencies from the
4 9-1-1 service district of the tentative 9-1-1 service plan
5 ~~pursuant to~~ UNDER section 306 and any failure of public safety
6 agencies to be designated as PSAPs or secondary PSAPs ~~pursuant~~
7 ~~to~~ UNDER section 307.

8 (l) "Person" means ~~any individual, firm, partnership, joint~~
9 ~~venture, association, cooperative organization, corporation,~~
10 ~~whether or not organized for profit, municipal corporation, state~~
11 ~~or other governmental entity, agency, body, department, commis-~~
12 ~~sion, board, bureau, fraternal organization, nonprofit organiza-~~
13 ~~tion, estate, trust, business or common law trust, receiver,~~
14 ~~assignee for the benefit of creditors, trustee, or trustee in~~
15 ~~bankruptcy.~~ AN INDIVIDUAL, CORPORATION, PARTNERSHIP, ASSOCIA-
16 TION, GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY, OR ANY OTHER LEGAL ENTITY.

17 (m) "Primary public safety answering point", "PSAP", or
18 "primary PSAP" means a communications facility operated or
19 answered on a 24-hour basis assigned responsibility by a public
20 agency or county to receive 9-1-1 calls and to dispatch public
21 safety response services, as appropriate, by the direct dispatch
22 method, relay method, or transfer method. It is the first point
23 of reception by a public safety agency of a 9-1-1 call and serves
24 the jurisdictions in which it is located and other participating
25 jurisdictions, if any.

1 (n) "Prime rate" means the average predominant prime rate
2 quoted by not less than 3 commercial financial institutions as
3 determined by the department of treasury.

4 (o) "Private safety entity" means a nongovernmental organi-
5 zation that provides emergency fire, ambulance, or medical
6 services.

7 (p) "Public agency" means ~~any~~ A village, township, charter
8 township, or city within the state ~~,~~ and any special purpose
9 district located in whole or in part within the state.

10 (q) "Public safety agency" means a functional division of a
11 public agency, county, or the state ~~of Michigan, which~~ THAT
12 provides fire fighting, law enforcement, ambulance, medical, or
13 other emergency services.

14 (r) "Relay method" means ~~the method of responding to a~~
15 ~~telephone request for emergency service whereby~~ THAT a PSAP
16 notes pertinent information and relays it by telephone, radio, or
17 private line to the appropriate public safety agency or other
18 provider of emergency services that has an available emergency
19 service unit located closest to the request for emergency service
20 for dispatch of an emergency service unit.

21 (s) "Secondary public safety answering point" or "secondary
22 PSAP" means a communications facility of a public safety agency
23 or private safety entity ~~which~~ THAT receives 9-1-1 calls by the
24 transfer method only and generally serves as a centralized loca-
25 tion for a particular type of emergency call.

26 (t) "Service supplier" means ~~any~~ A person providing
27 telephone services to a service user in this state.

1 (u) "Service user" means ~~any~~ AN exchange access facility
2 customer of a service supplier within a 9-1-1 system.

3 (v) "Tariff" means the rate approved by the public service
4 commission for 9-1-1 service provided by a particular service
5 supplier.

6 (w) "Tentative 9-1-1 service plan" means a plan prepared by
7 1 or more counties for implementing a 9-1-1 system in a specified
8 9-1-1 service district.

9 (x) "Transfer method" means ~~the method of responding to a~~
10 ~~telephone request for emergency service whereby~~ THAT a PSAP
11 transfers the 9-1-1 call directly to the appropriate public
12 safety agency or other provider of emergency service that has an
13 available emergency service unit located closest to the request
14 for emergency service for dispatch of an emergency service unit.

15 (y) "Universal emergency number service" or "9-1-1 service"
16 means public telephone service ~~which~~ THAT provides service
17 users with the ability to reach a public safety answering point
18 by dialing the digits "9-1-1".

19 (z) "Universal emergency number service system" or "9-1-1
20 system" means a system for providing 9-1-1 service ~~pursuant to~~
21 UNDER this act.
