

HOUSE BILL No. 5801

April 24, 1996, Introduced by Reps. Crissman, Green, Horton, LeTarte, Law, Gustafson, Goschka, Jamian, Hill, Rhead, Llewellyn, McBryde, Voorhees, Middleton, Brackenridge, Dobb, Kukuk, Kaza, London, Geiger, Gilmer, Sikkema, Bodem, Gnodtke, Bush, Ryan, Whyman, McManus, Galloway, Middaugh and Perricone and referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Civil Rights.

A bill to amend section 224f of Act No. 328 of the Public Acts of 1931, entitled as amended
"The Michigan penal code,"

as added by Act No. 217 of the Public Acts of 1992, being section 750.224f of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Section 224f of Act No. 328 of the Public Acts
- 2 of 1931, as added by Act No. 217 of the Public Acts of 1992,
- 3 being section 750.224f of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 224f. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), a
- 6 person convicted of a felony OR ADJUDICATED AS RESPONSIBLE FOR AN
- 7 ACT THAT IF COMMITTED BY AN ADULT WOULD BE A FELONY shall not
- 8 possess, use, transport, sell, purchase, carry, ship, receive, or
- 9 distribute a firearm in this state until the expiration of 3

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- I years after all of the following circumstances exist, AS
- 2 APPLICABLE:
- 3 (a) The person has paid all fines imposed for the
- 4 violation.
- 5 (b) The person has served all terms of imprisonment imposed
- 6 for the violation.
- 7 (c) The person has successfully completed all conditions of
- 8 probation or parole imposed for the violation.
- 9 (D) THE PERSON HAS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED ALL TERMS, CONDI-
- 10 TIONS, OR REQUIREMENTS IMPOSED FOR THE VIOLATION IN THE ORDER OF
- 11 DISPOSITION.
- 12 (2) A person convicted of a specified felony OR ADJUDICATED
- 13 AS RESPONSIBLE FOR AN ACT THAT IF COMMITTED BY AN ADULT WOULD BE
- 14 A SPECIFIED FELONY shall not possess, use, transport, sell, pur-
- 15 chase, carry, ship, receive, or distribute a firearm in this
- 16 state until all of the following circumstances exist:
- 17 (a) The expiration of 5 years after all of the following
- 18 circumstances exist, AS APPLICABLE:
- (i) The person has paid all fines imposed for the
- 20 violation.
- 21 (ii) The person has served all terms of imprisonment imposed
- 22 for the violation.
- 23 (iii) The person has successfully completed all conditions
- 24 of probation or parole imposed for the violation.
- 25 (ίυ) THE PERSON HAS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED ALL TERMS, CONDI-
- 26 TIONS, OR REQUIREMENTS IMPOSED FOR THE VIOLATION IN THE ORDER OF
- 27 DISPOSITION.

- 1 (b) The person's right to possess, use, transport, sell,
- 2 purchase, carry, ship, receive, or distribute a firearm has been
- 3 restored -pursuant-to- UNDER section 4 of Act No. 372 of the
- 4 Public Acts of 1927, being section 28.424 of the Michigan
- 5 Compiled Laws.
- 6 (3) A person who possesses, uses, transports, sells, pur-
- 7 chases, carries, ships, receives, or distributes a firearm in
- 8 violation of this section is guilty of a felony -, punishable by
- 9 imprisonment for not more than 5 years or a fine of not more
- 10 than \$5,000.00, or both.
- 11 (4) This section does not apply to a conviction OR
- 12 ADJUDICATION that has been expunged or set aside, or for which
- 13 the person has been pardoned, unless the expunction, order, or
- 14 pardon expressly provides that the person shall not possess a
- 15 firearm.
- 16 (5) As used in this section, "felony" means a violation of a
- 17 law of this state, or of another state, or of the United States
- 18 that is punishable by imprisonment for 4 years or more, or an
- 19 attempt to violate such a law,
- 20 (6) As used in subsection (2), "specified felony" means a
- 21 felony in which 1 or more of the following circumstances exist:
- (A) -(i) An element of that felony is the use, attempted
- 23 use, or threatened use of physical force against the person or
- 24 property of another, or that by its nature, involves a substan-
- 25 tial risk that physical force against the person or property of
- 26 another may be used in the course of committing the offense.

- 1 (B) -(ii) An element of that felony is the unlawful
- 2 manufacture, possession, importation, exportation, distribution,
- 3 or dispensing of a controlled substance.
- 4 (C) -(iii) An element of that felony is the unlawful pos-
- 5 session or distribution of a firearm.
- 6 (D) -(iv) An element of that felony is the unlawful use of
- 7 an explosive.
- 8 (E) -(v) The felony is burglary of an occupied dwelling,
- 9 or breaking and entering an occupied dwelling, HOME INVASION,
- 10 or arson.
- 11 Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
- 12 Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. 5802 (request
- 13 no. 05142'95 a) of the 88th Legislature is enacted into law.
