



SENATE BILL No. 600

June 15, 1995, Introduced by Senators DINGELL, GEAKE, GOUGEON, HOFFMAN, MCMANUS, PETERS and EMMONS and referred to the Committee on Families, Mental Health and Human Services.

A bill to amend section 1147 of Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1976, entitled as amended

"The school code of 1976,"

being section 380.1147 of the Michigan Compiled Laws; and to add section 1148a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Section 1147 of Act No. 451 of the Public Acts
2 of 1976, being section 380.1147 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is
3 amended and section 1148a is added to read as follows:

4 Sec. 1147. (1) A person ~~, resident of~~ WHO RESIDES IN a
5 school district not maintaining a kindergarten and IS at least 5
6 years of age on the first day of enrollment of the school year ~~7~~
7 ~~shall have a right to~~ MAY attend school in the district.

8 (2) In a school district ~~where provision is made for~~ THAT
9 MAINTAINS A kindergarten, ~~work,~~ a child ~~, resident of~~ WHO

1 RESIDES IN the district, ~~is entitled to enroll in the~~
2 ~~kindergarten if the child~~ AND is at least 5 years of age on
3 December 1 of the school year of enrollment MAY ENROLL IN THE
4 KINDERGARTEN. In a school district ~~which~~ THAT has semiannual
5 promotions, a child ~~, resident of~~ WHO RESIDES IN the district
6 ~~, is entitled to enroll in kindergarten for the second semester~~
7 ~~if the child~~ AND is at least 5 years of age on March 1 of the
8 year of enrollment MAY ENROLL IN THE KINDERGARTEN FOR THE SECOND
9 SEMESTER.

10 (3) THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO SECTIONS 1148 AND 1148A.

11 SEC. 1148A. IF A CHILD RESIDES REGULARLY IN 2 DIFFERENT
12 SCHOOL DISTRICTS AS A RESULT OF A JOINT CUSTODY ORDER BY A COURT,
13 THE CHILD SHALL BE CONSIDERED TO BE A RESIDENT OF BOTH SCHOOL
14 DISTRICTS FOR EDUCATION PURPOSES UNDER THIS ACT AND, IF THE CHILD
15 MEETS THE APPLICABLE AGE REQUIREMENTS, THE CHILD MAY ATTEND
16 SCHOOL IN EITHER OR BOTH OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

17 Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
