

SENATE BILL No. 766

November 28, 1995, Introduced by Senators HONIGMAN and CISKY and referred to the Committee on Local, Urban and State Affairs.

A bill to prohibit governmental entities from requiring individuals to reside within certain geographic areas as a condition of employment or promotion.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act, "public employer" means this
- 2 state or a county, township, village, city, authority, or other
- 3 political subdivision of this state and includes any entity
- 4 jointly created by 2 or more public employers. Public employer
- 5 does not include institutions of higher education, as that term
- 6 is used in article VIII of the state constitution of 1963.
- Sec. 2. A public employer shall not require, by collective
- 8 bargaining agreement or otherwise, that a person reside within a
- 9 specified geographic area or within a specified distance or
- 10 travel time from his or her place of employment as a condition of
- 11 employment or promotion by the public employer.

- 1 Sec. 3. This act does not apply to:
- 2 (a) A residency requirement contained in or specifically
- 3 authorized by state law.
- 4 (b) A residency requirement for a member of the classified
- 5 state civil service.
- 6 (c) A requirement of a public employer that a person reside
- 7 within this state as a condition of employment or promotion with
- 8 the public employer.
