

SENATE BILL No. 1119

September 10, 1996, Introduced by Senator BOUCHARD and referred to the Committee on Finance.

A bill to amend sections 6c and 6d of Act No. 157 of the Public Acts of 1905, entitled as amended

"An act to provide for the acquisition, maintenance, management, and control of township parks, resorts, bathing beaches, and places of recreation; to provide for the creation of a township park commission; to provide for a board of commissioners to provide for the issuance of bonds and the levy of taxes; to provide for the transfer of certain real property for parks; to authorize cities and villages to appropriate money for park purposes; to provide for the acquisition, construction, and use of wharves, piers, docks, and landing places in townships; and to provide the powers and duties of certain local units of government and certain officials,"

as added by Act No. 79 of the Public Acts of 1989, being sections 41.426c and 41.426d of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Sections 6c and 6d of Act No. 157 of the Public
- 2 Acts of 1905, as added by Act No. 79 of the Public Acts of 1989,
- 3 being sections 41.426c and 41.426d of the Michigan Compiled Laws,
- 4 are amended to read as follows:

- Sec. 6c. (1) The township park commission shall submit to
- 2 the township board a detailed budget covering the cost of mainte-
- 3 nance of the township parks and places of recreation of the town-
- 4 ship for the ensuing year. -The BEFORE 1997, THE budget shall
- 5 not exceed -1 and 1/2 1.5 mill on the assessed valuation of the
- 5 township. AFTER 1996, THE BUDGET SHALL NOT EXCEED 1.5 MILL ON
- 7 THE TAXABLE VALUE OF THE TOWNSHIP. The township board shall
- 8 examine the budget and shall approve the entire budget, or a part
- 9 of the budget that the board considers reasonable and necessary,
- 10 which -sum shall be incorporated into the tax on the township,
- II and when collected shall be deposited by the township treasurer
- 12 in a fund to be known as the park maintenance fund. Expenditures
- 13 from -this- THE PARK MAINTENANCE fund shall be on vouchers
- 14 approved by the township park commission, and -it-shall be the

- 18 formed in the manner provided in the general property tax act,

- 25 Sec. 6d. The township park commission may request that the
- 26 township board submit to the voters of the township the question
- 27 of the issuance of township bonds, the proceeds of which shall be

I used in the acquisition of lands for township parks and places of 2 recreation. A majority vote of the qualified voters voting shall 3 authorize the issuance of township bonds. The issuance of town-4 ship bonds shall be governed by the municipal finance act, Act 5 No. 202 of the Public Acts of 1943, being sections 131.1 to 139.3 6 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. -However- BEFORE 1997, if the 7 township has no outstanding indebtedness, bonded or otherwise, 8 and the amount of the total proposed acquisition cost is less 9 than - 1 per cent- 1% of the assessed valuation of the township, 10 the township board may authorize and direct the township park II commission to purchase or condemn designated lands for township 12 parks and places of recreation and may pay annually to the town-13 ship park commission the available portions of contingent funds 14 of the township necessary to pay for the acquisition of the 15 lands. AFTER 1996, IF THE TOWNSHIP HAS NO OUTSTANDING INDEBTED-16 NESS, BONDED OR OTHERWISE, AND THE AMOUNT OF THE TOTAL PROPOSED 17 ACOUISITION COST IS LESS THAN 1% OF THE TAXABLE VALUE OF THE 18 TOWNSHIP, THE TOWNSHIP BOARD MAY AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE TOWN-SHIP PARK COMMISSION TO PURCHASE OR CONDEMN DESIGNATED LANDS FOR 20 TOWNSHIP PARKS AND PLACES OF RECREATION AND MAY PAY ANNUALLY TO THE TOWNSHIP PARK COMMISSION THE AVAILABLE PORTIONS OF CONTINGENT 22 FUNDS OF THE TOWNSHIP NECESSARY TO PAY FOR THE ACQUISITION OF THE 23 LANDS. The township board shall determine the maximum amount to 24 be paid for these lands and, if acquisition is made by purchase 25 instead of condemnation, shall also prescribe the terms of 26 payment.
