



HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION B

January 11, 1995, Introduced by Reps. Whyman, Jaye, Horton, Walberg, Dalman, Rocca, Oxender, Hill, Voorhees, Llewellyn, Sikkema, Ryan, Lowe, Bullard, Perricone, Crissman, Bush, Cropsey, Kaza and Goschka and referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Civil Rights.

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to the state constitution of 1963, by adding section 31 to article VI, to provide that the courts of this state do not have the power to levy or increase a tax.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the state of Michigan, That the following amendment to the state constitution of 1963, to provide that the courts of this state do not have the power to levy or increase a tax, is proposed, agreed to, and submitted to the people of the state:

ARTICLE VI

1
2 SEC. 31. THE SUPREME COURT AND ALL INFERIOR COURTS OF THIS
3 STATE DO NOT HAVE THE POWER TO INSTRUCT OR ORDER THIS STATE OR A
4 POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THIS STATE, OR AN OFFICIAL OF THIS STATE
5 OR OF A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THIS STATE, TO LEVY OR INCREASE
6 TAXES.

1 Resolved further, That the foregoing amendment shall be
2 submitted to the people of the state at the next general election
3 in the manner provided by law.
