SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4045

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 3112a (MCL 324.3112a).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3112a. (1) If untreated sewage THAT HAS NOT RECEIVED
- 2 ALL TREATMENT THAT IS AVAILABLE AND UTILIZED UNDER ORDINARY DRY
- 3 WEATHER CONDITIONS IS DISCHARGED from a combined sewer system is
- 4 discharged into the waters of the state, the municipality
- 5 responsible for the discharge shall do all of the following:
- 6 (a) Notify IMMEDIATELY, BUT NOT MORE THAN 24 HOURS AFTER THE
- 7 DISCHARGE BEGINS, NOTIFY the department; local health departments
- 8 as defined in section 1105 of the public health code, Act
- 9 No. 368 of the Public Acts of 1978, being section 333.1105 of the
- 10 Michigan Compiled Laws 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.1105; a daily
- 11 newspaper of general circulation in the county or counties in

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- **1** which a municipality notified pursuant to subsection $\frac{(2)}{(4)}$
- 2 is located; and a daily newspaper of general circulation in the
- 3 county in which the municipality responsible for the discharge is
- 4 located of all of the following:
- 5 (A) $\frac{(i)}{(i)}$ Promptly after the discharge starts, that the dis-
- 6 charge is occurring.
- 7 (B) $\frac{(ii)}{(ii)}$ At the conclusion of the discharge, in writing,
- 8 all of the following:
- 9 (i) $\overline{(A)}$ The amount of the discharge as measured pursuant
- 10 to procedures approved by the department.
- 11 (ii) $\overline{(B)}$ The reason for the discharge.
- 12 (iii) $\overline{(C)}$ The time the discharge began and ended as mea-
- 13 sured pursuant to procedures approved by the department.
- 14 (iv) $\overline{(D)}$ Verification that the municipality is in full
- 15 compliance with the requirements of its national pollutant dis-
- 16 charge elimination system permit.
- 17 (2) (b) Upon the request of a local health department
- 18 responsible for testing the affected waters, either pay the
- 19 actual reasonable cost of the testing that is necessary to assess
- 20 the risk to the public health as a result of the discharge or, if
- 21 the municipality has conducted testing necessary to assess the
- 22 risk to public health as a result of the discharge, provide the
- 23 test results to the local health department. EACH TIME A DIS-
- 24 CHARGE OCCURS UNDER SUBSECTION (1), THE PERMITEE SHALL TEST THE
- 25 AFFECTED WATERS FOR E. COLI TO ASSESS THE RISK TO THE PUBLIC
- 26 HEALTH AS A RESULT OF THE DISCHARGE AND SHALL PROVIDE THE TEST
- 27 RESULTS TO THE AFFECTED LOCAL COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENTS. THE

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- 1 TESTING SHALL BE DONE AT LOCATIONS SPECIFIED BY EACH AFFECTED
- 2 LOCAL COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT BUT SHALL NOT EXCEED 10 TESTS FOR
- 3 EACH SEPARATE DISCHARGE EVENT. THE REQUIREMENT FOR THIS TESTING
- 4 MAY BE WAIVED BY THE AFFECTED LOCAL COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT IF
- 5 THE AFFECTED LOCAL COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT DETERMINES THAT SUCH
- 6 TESTING IS NOT NEEDED TO ASSESS THE RISK TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH AS
- 7 A RESULT OF THE DISCHARGE EVENT.
- 8 (3) $\overline{(2)}$ A municipality that operates a combined sewer
- 9 system that may discharge untreated sewage into the waters of the
- 10 state shall annually contact municipalities whose waters may be
- 11 affected by such discharges, and if those contacted municipali-
- 12 ties wish to be notified in the same manner as provided in sub-
- 13 section (1), the municipality operating the combined sewer system
- 14 shall provide that notification.
- 15 (4) -(3) A municipality that is responsible for a discharge
- 16 of untreated sewage from a combined sewer system into the waters
- 17 of the state shall -meet COMPLY WITH the requirements of its
- 18 national pollutant discharge elimination system permit.
- 19 (5) $\overline{(4)}$ This section does not authorize the discharge of
- 20 untreated sewage into the waters of the state or limit the state
- 21 from bringing legal action as otherwise authorized by this part.
- 22 (6) $\overline{(5)}$ "Combined sewer system" means a sewer designed and
- 23 used to convey both storm water runoff and sanitary sewage, and
- 24 which contains lawfully installed regulators and control devices
- 25 that allow for delivery of sanitary flow to treatment during dry
- 26 weather periods and divert storm water and sanitary sewage to
- 27 surface waters during storm flow periods.
