- 9 BEEN FOUND AFTER REASONABLE EFFORTS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED
- 10 TO, EVALUATION BY THE ATTENDING PHYSICIAN AND BY 1 OR MORE OTHER
- 11 PHYSICIANS SPECIALIZING IN THE TREATMENT OF THE AREA, SYSTEM, OR
- 12 ORGAN OF THE BODY PERCEIVED AS THE SOURCE OF THE PAIN.
