## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5642

A bill to amend 1956 PA 218, entitled "The insurance code of 1956,"

by amending section 2210 (MCL 500.2210), as amended by 1994 PA 227.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2210. (1) As used in this section:
- 2 (a) "Employee <del>welfare</del> benefit plan" means that term as
- 3 defined by the employee retirement income security act of 1974,
- 4 Public Law 93-406, 88 Stat. 829.
- 5 (b) "Employer" means an individual, sole proprietorship,
- 6 partnership, firm, corporation, association, or any other legal
- 7 entity, which has 1 or more employees and is legally doing busi-
- 8 ness in this state.
- **9** (c) "Trust" means a trust established by an employer. and
- 10 maintained for the sole purpose of providing for the cost of

- 1 benefits under an employee welfare benefit plan maintained for
- 2 employees or retired employees, including a sole proprietor or a
- 3 partner of the employer, and their qualified dependents and
- 4 beneficiaries.
- 5 (2) Notwithstanding any other section of this act, an
- 6 employer OR A TRUST has an insurable interest in, and may, with
- 7 the written consent of the insured, insure on an individual or
- 8 group basis for its benefit the lives of its THE EMPLOYER'S
- 9 directors, officers, managers, nonmanagement employees, and its
- 10 retired employees. An employer OR A TRUST may insure the lives
- 11 of its THE EMPLOYER'S nonmanagement employees and its retired
- 12 employees only if those persons give written consent to be
- 13 insured and the coverage is limited to an amount reasonably com-
- 14 mensurate with the employer's projected unfunded liabilities to
- 15 nonmanagement and retired employees for employee -welfare bene-
- 16 fit plans, calculated according to accepted actuarial
- 17 principles. An employer shall not retaliate in any manner

- 1 may insure the life of a nonmanagement employee and a retired
- 2 employee only if that person is given written notice of the cov-
- 3 erage, he or she has not notified either the employer or the
- 4 trustee TRUST in writing that he or she does not want to be
- 5 insured for the coverage, and the coverage is limited to an
- 6 amount reasonably commensurate with the employer's projected
- 7 unfunded liabilities to nonmanagement and retired employees for
- 8 employee -welfare benefit plans, calculated according to
- 9 accepted actuarial principles. An employer or a trustee TRUST
- 10 shall not retaliate in any manner against an employee or a
- 11 retired employee for providing the written notice that he or she
- 12 does not want to be insured for the coverage.
- (4) The proceeds of any policy or certificate issued pursu-
- 14 ant to subsection (2) or (3)  $\rightarrow$  ARE exempt from the claims of
- 15 any creditor or dependent of the insured.
