## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5818

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 82108 and 82120 (MCL 324.82108 and 324.82120), as added by 1995 PA 58, and by adding sections 82107a and 82123a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 82107A. BY APRIL 1, 1999, THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTA-
- 2 TION WITH THE MICHIGAN SNOWMOBILE ADVISORY COMMITTEE, SHALL
- 3 DEVELOP AND PRESENT TO THE LEGISLATURE A PLAN FOR STATE AND LOCAL
- 4 LAW ENFORCEMENT.
- 5 Sec. 82108. (1) The <del>department shall design by May 1, 1995</del>
- 6 the minimum content of a comprehensive snowmobile safety educa-
- 7 tion and training program -, which shall include the preparation
- 8 and dissemination of snowmobile information and safety advice to
- 9 the public and training of operators. The content of the program

1 shall include provision for the training of youthful operators at

- **2** least 12 but less than  $\frac{17}{1}$  20 years of age and for the issuance
- 3 of snowmobile safety certificates to those who successfully com-
- 4 plete the training provided under the program. A person less
- **5** than  $\frac{17}{10}$  20 years of age who successfully completes a training
- 6 program shall carry the safety certificate on his or her person
- 7 whenever operating a snowmobile in this state. The department
- 8 and the counties shall encourage persons 17 20 years of age or
- 9 over to take the program.
- 10 (2) The minimum content of a snowmobile safety education and
- 11 training program shall include the following:
- 12 (a) Description of the snowmobile and its main parts.
- 13 (b) Description of machine controls, safety and operating
- 14 procedures, and loading and towing procedures.
- 15 (c) General content of snowmobile and highway laws and
- 16 rules.
- 17 (d) Safety hazards of operation, including possible hearing
- 18 damage, and environmental consequences of snowmobile use.
- 19 (e) Performance and written tests.
- 20 (f) Familiarization with the snowmobile trail system in this
- 21 state.
- 22 (G) SNOWMOBILE CODE OF ETHICS.
- 23 (3) The fee charged by a county for a training program shall
- **24** be not more than \$5.00.
- 25 (4) In implementing a program that is established pursuant
- 26 to this section, the department shall cooperate with private
- 27 organizations and associations, private and public corporations,

- 1 schools, and local governmental units. The department shall
- 2 consult with the department of state police and county sheriffs
- 3 in regard to subject matter of a training program and performance

- 4 testing that leads to certification of snowmobile operators.
- 5 However, a county may expand the course content beyond the mini-
- 6 mum requirements established by subsection (2).
- 7 (5) The department may designate any person it considers
- 8 qualified to provide course instruction and to award snowmobile
- 9 safety certificates.
- 10 (6) A person less than  $\frac{17}{1}$  20 years of age who fails to
- 11 have a safety certificate on his or her person is subject to a
- 12 fine of not more than \$25.00.
- 13 (7) A person who has a valid safety certificate from another
- 14 state or province shall not be required to complete the safety
- 15 education and training program in this state.
- 16 Sec. 82120. (1) A parent or legal guardian shall not permit
- 17 his or her child who is less than 12 years of age to operate a
- 18 snowmobile without the direct supervision of an adult except on
- 19 land owned or under the control of the parent or legal guardian.
- 20 (2) A person who is at least 12 but less than  $\frac{17}{20}$  20 years
- 21 of age may operate a snowmobile if 1 of the following conditions
- 22 exist:
- 23 (a) The person is under the direct supervision of a person
- 24 who is 21 years of age or older.
- 25 (b) The person has in his or her immediate possession a
- 26 snowmobile safety certificate issued pursuant to a program
- 27 conducted under section  $\frac{82107}{}$  82108.

1 (c) The person is on land owned or under the control of his 2 or her parent or legal guardian.

- **3** (d) The person possesses a snowmobile safety certificate
- 4 issued to the person under the authority of a law of another
- 5 state or province of Canada.
- **6** (3) A person who is operating a snowmobile pursuant to sub-
- 7 section (2)(b) shall present the snowmobile safety certificate to
- 8 any peace officer upon demand.
- 9 (4) Notwithstanding section 82119, an operator who is less
- 10 than  $\frac{12}{12}$  14 years of age shall not cross a highway or street.
- 11 An operator who is at least  $\frac{12}{12}$  14 years of age but less than
- 12 -17 20 years of age may cross a highway or street only if he or
- 13 she has a valid snowmobile safety certificate in his or her imme-
- 14 diate possession.
- 15 (5) The owner of a snowmobile shall not permit the snowmo-
- 16 bile to be operated contrary to this section.
- 17 (6) When the judge of a juvenile THE FAMILY DIVISION OF
- 18 CIRCUIT court determines that a person who is less than 17 years
- 19 of age has violated this part, the judge shall immediately report
- 20 the determination to the department. The department upon receiv-
- 21 ing a notice of a determination pursuant to this subsection may
- 22 suspend the snowmobile safety certificate without a hearing.
- 23 SEC. 82123A. A PERSON SHALL NOT OPERATE, OFFER FOR SALE, OR
- 24 SELL A SNOWMOBILE MANUFACTURED AFTER JANUARY 1, 1999 THAT HAS A
- 25 WIDTH GREATER THAN 48 INCHES.
