SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5637

A bill to create the Michigan freedom trail commission; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state departments, agencies, commissions, and officers.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "Michigan freedom trail commission act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Department" means the department of state.
- 5 (b) "Michigan freedom trail commission" or "commission"
- ${f 6}$ means the Michigan freedom trail commission created in section
- **7** 3.
- 8 Sec. 3. (1) The Michigan freedom trail commission is cre-
- 9 ated within the department of state. The commission shall
- 10 exercise its prescribed duties and functions independently of the
- 11 secretary of state. However, the budgeting, procurement, and

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- 1 related functions of the commission and administrative
- 2 responsibilities for the staff of the commission shall be per-
- ${f 3}$ formed under the direction and supervision of the secretary of
- 4 state.
- 5 (2) The commission shall consist of the following:
- **6** (a) Members appointed by the governor, as follows:
- 7 (i) Three members from the academic community knowledgeable
- 8 in African-American history.
- 9 (ii) One member actively involved in civil rights issues.
- 10 (iii) One member knowledgeable in historic preservation.
- 11 (iv) One member representing local communities in which the
- 12 underground railroad had a significant presence.
- (v) Three members at large, 1 of whom shall be a representa-
- 14 tive of the museum of African American history located in the
- 15 city of Detroit.
- 16 (b) Members serving ex officio without vote as follows:
- 17 (i) The chief executive officer of the Michigan jobs commis-
- 18 sion or his or her representative.
- 19 (ii) The state librarian or his or her representative.
- 20 (iii) The secretary of state or his or her representative.
- 21 (3) The members appointed under subsection (2)(a) first
- 22 appointed to the commission shall be appointed within 90 days
- 23 after the effective date of this act.
- 24 (4) Members of the commission appointed under
- 25 subsection (2)(a) shall serve for terms of 4 years or until a
- 26 successor is appointed, whichever is later, except that of the

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- ${f 1}$ members first appointed 3 shall serve for 1 year, 3 shall serve
- 2 for 2 years, and 3 shall serve for 3 years.
- **3** (5) If a vacancy occurs on the commission among members
- 4 appointed under subsection (2)(a), the governor shall make an
- 5 appointment for the unexpired term in the same manner as the
- 6 original appointment.
- 7 (6) The governor may remove a member of the commission for
- 8 incompetency, dereliction of duty, malfeasance, misfeasance, or
- 9 nonfeasance in office, or any other good cause.
- 10 (7) At the first meeting, the commission shall elect from
- 11 among its members a chairperson and other officers as it consid-
- 12 ers necessary or appropriate. After the first meeting, the com-
- 13 mission shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at the
- 14 call of the chairperson or if requested by 6 or more members
- 15 appointed under subsection (2)(a).
- 16 (8) A majority of the members of the commission appointed
- 17 under subsection (2)(a) constitute a quorum for the transaction
- 18 of business at a meeting of the commission. A majority of the
- 19 members appointed under subsection (2)(a) present and serving are
- 20 required for official action of the commission.
- 21 (9) The business that the commission may perform shall be
- 22 conducted at a public meeting of the commission held in compli-
- 23 ance with the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to
- **24** 15.275.
- 25 (10) A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of,
- 26 or retained by the commission in the performance of an official

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- 1 function is subject to the freedom of information act, 1976 PA
- **2** 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- (11) Members of the commission shall serve without 3
- 4 compensation. However, members of the commission may be reim-
- 5 bursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the
- 6 performance of their official duties as members of the
- 7 commission.
- Sec. 4. The commission shall do all of the following: 8
- 9 (a) Review, plan, and implement a master plan to promote and
- 10 preserve the history of the freedom trail and underground rail-
- 11 road in this state.
- 12 (b) Work in conjunction with state and federal authorities
- 13 to sponsor commemorations, linkages, seminars, and public forums
- 14 on the freedom trail and underground railroad in this state and
- 15 neighboring states.
- 16 (c) Assist and promote the making of applications for inclu-
- 17 sion in the national and state register of historic places for
- 18 significant historic places related to the freedom trail and the
- 19 underground railroad in Michigan.
- 20 (d) Assist and develop partnerships to seek public and pri-
- 21 vate funds to carry out activities to protect, preserve, and pro-
- 22 mote the legacy of the freedom trail and underground railroad in
- 23 this state.
- 24 The commission shall annually report to the gover-
- 25 nor and both houses of the legislature on the activities of the
- 26 commission in the prior calendar year.
