

**HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR  
SENATE BILL NO. 252**

A bill to make supplemental appropriations for the department of natural resources for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1998; to provide for the acquisition of land; to provide for the development of public recreation facilities; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials; to make supplemental appropriations for the capital outlay and for the department[s of community health and] military and veterans affairs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1997; to provide for [certain advances from the general fund for the department of treasury; and to provide for] the expenditure of appropriations.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

1       Sec. 101. There is appropriated for the development of natural  
2 resources to supplement former appropriations for the fiscal year ending  
3 September 30, 1998, the sum of \$9,815,400.00 for land acquisition and  
4 grants and \$3,269,800.00 for public recreation facility development and  
5 grants as provided in section 35 of article IX of the state constitution  
6 of 1963 and part 19 (natural resources trust fund) of the natural

**1 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES**

2       Sec. 301. The department of natural resources shall enter into  
3 agreements with local units of government for the purpose of administer-  
4 ing the grants identified in section 101. Among other provisions, the  
5 agreements shall require that grant recipients agree to dedicate to  
6 public recreation uses in perpetuity the land acquired; to replace lands  
7 converted or lost to other than public recreation use; and to convey to  
8 the state any mineral interests acquired by the grant recipient with an  
9 exception allowed for a share of the mineral interests acquired, which  
10 share is based on the portion of the fair market value of the property  
11 that was provided by the local cash contribution of the grant recipient.  
12 The agreement shall also provide the full payments of grants be made only  
13 after proof of acquisition is submitted by the grant recipient and all  
14 costs are verified by the department of natural resources.

15       Sec. 302. The department of natural resources shall take steps nec-  
16 essary to make available federal or other funds that may become available  
17 for the purpose for which appropriations are made in section 101, and to  
18 use any or all of the appropriations to meet matching requirements which  
19 are determined to be in the best interest of the state.

20       Sec. 303. Any unobligated balance in any appropriation made under  
21 section 101 shall not revert to the fund from which appropriated at the  
22 close of the fiscal year, but shall continue until the purpose for which  
23 it was appropriated is completed for a period not to exceed 3 fiscal  
24 years. The unexpended balance of any appropriation made in section 101  
25 remaining after the purpose for which it was appropriated is completed  
26 shall revert to the Michigan natural resources trust fund and be made  
27 available for appropriation.

1       Sec. 304. If a person or organization has acquired an option on a  
2 parcel of property prior to final determination by the department of nat-  
3 ural resources and the Michigan natural resources trust fund board, the  
4 property shall not be considered for acquisition unless the department  
5 and board can demonstrate that a clear recreational advantage exists in  
6 obtaining the parcel of property for the people of the state at a reason-  
7 able fair market value.

**8 GENERAL SECTIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1996-97**

9       Sec. 1201. In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of arti-  
10 cle IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending from state  
11 sources for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1997, is [\$4,400,000.00]  
12 and state appropriations to be paid to local units of government in  
13 section 102 are \$0.

**14 CAPITAL OUTLAY**

15       Sec. 1301. From the funds appropriated in section 101 of 1996 PA  
16 363, the department of military and veterans affairs is authorized to  
17 purchase that parcel of land on which the hangar facility is located at  
18 the Grand Ledge Abrams municipal airport.

**1 TREASURY**

2       Sec. 1401. (1) Funds appropriated in section [4b(1)] of 1997 PA 69,  
3 for casino gaming, Michigan gaming control board, and casino gaming con-  
4 trol administration shall be financed entirely by the state casino gaming  
5 fund if sufficient funds are available in the state casino gaming fund.  
6 If sufficient funds are not available in the state casino gaming fund,  
7 the director of the department of management and budget may make advances  
8 from the general fund to fully fund these appropriations in amounts not  
9 to exceed those in section [4b(1)] of 1997 PA 69.

10       (2) Any general fund advances made for casino gaming, Michigan  
11 gaming control board, or casino gaming control administration in the  
12 fiscal year ending September 30, 1997 shall be reimbursed from the state  
13 casino gaming fund with interest in an amount and manner consistent with  
14 the operating practices of this state's common cash fund.

15       (3) If general fund advances are made under subsection (1), funds  
16 subsequently received in the state casino gaming fund shall be used first  
17 to reimburse the general fund before any additional appropriations are  
18 made for casino gaming, Michigan gaming control board, or casino gaming  
19 control administration.
